

In the name of God, Amen I Jesse Peacock of the County of
Cumberland in the State of North Carolina, being in a low
state of health, but of sound disposing mind and memory
and knowing that it is now appointed for all men to die, do
make and ordain this to be my Last Will and Testament
in manner and form following. First I will and desire
that my Executors hereafter named do discharge my finan-
cial charges and Expenses out of the first debts collected
owed to me or out the most perishable part of my
Estate—
Secondly. I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife ~~Elizabeth~~
Elizabeth Peacock, my negress woman Rachael, my two
horses, my riding chair, the one half of my Trunk bed
and bedding furniture of every kind and description, and
the one half of all my House hold and kitchen furniture
of every kind, and the same to be divided as soon as possible
by my Executors and her part to be thereupon delivered up to
her, I also lend unto my said Wife during the term of her
natural life my Dwelling house kitchen and out Houses
on my Lot in Fayetteville, and the one half of my said
Lot, meaning the Western half of the Lot and some ground
whereon the Dwelling House and Kitchen stand.—

Thirdly. I give and bequeath unto my two Sons, Abraham Peacock
and William Peacock, my two negress men Dublin and Abel and
also my two negress girls Dolly and Moll, to be equally divid-
ed, between them when my Son Abraham shall arrive at
the age of twenty, one year, and the profits that may arise
from their Labour untill my said Son Abraham arrives

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to the age of twenty one year of age also to be equally
divided between them.

Fourthly. I give and bequeath unto my two Sons Abraham
and William Peacock a Tract of Land containing one
hundred and fifty Acres lying in this County and that
I lately bought from William Armstrong, and also my
Lott and buildings thereon in Fayette Vt. reserving the part
of the Lott and buildings thereon heretofore described to their
said Mother Elizabeth Peacock during her natural life,
to them their heirs or Assigns for ever.

Fifthly. I give and bequeath unto my said two Sons Abraham and
William, the one half of all my feather beds and bedding, furni-
ture of every kind and description, the one half of all my Chan-
deliers and kitchen furniture of every kind and description
and the same to remain in the care and possession of their
said Mother untill Abraham arrives at the age of twenty one
years of age, provided their mother should not take
good care of said articles and make frugal use of the
the same, then I will that my Executors take the same into
their possession and sell the same for the benefit of my
said Sons.

Sixthly. I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth
Peacock all my Stock of Cattle.

Seventhly. I give and bequeath unto my said two Sons Abraham
and William Peacock every other article or Interest of my Estate
not particularly mentioned and Willed, after all my Just debts
are settled. Eighthly. I do hereby constitute and appoint my
Trustees

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Trusty friends J^{es} Potters & The Quaker Eccles of
and to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoc-
king all former Will by me made, In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal at
Fayetteville this 26th day of September Anno
Dom. 1796.
