two sons John and John Stubbs.

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I also give and bequeath unto
My loving wife after mentioned
three Negroes named as follows,
one Negro man named Pinck
one Negro woman named Phoebe

also one Negro woman named Alice and one
Negro woman named Chir. Natural life and
after the death to Equally divided
Between My son. Joseph and Mary
Mary Elizabeth. Nancy and Deborah
Stubbs. with and with part of the
Inventories

I Give and Bequeath unto
My son John Stubbs one third part
of My plantation ~~whereon I now live~~
whereon I now live to be land of the
lower side with the third part
of My Saw Mills land and timber
belonging thereto I Give and
bequeath to My son John one hundred
and fifty Acres. by my & Sonny Chas. G.
I Give -

I Give and Bequeath unto
John Stubbs one third part of My
plantation whereon I now live to be
be land of being the upper side of
John Stubbs. third part. with the third
part of My Saw Mills land and timber
belonging thereto,

Item, I give and bequeath unto my
daughter Mary Sturby a Negro Boy
named Dick

Item I Give and bequeath unto my
Daughter Elizabeth Sturby one Negro
Boy named Guy.

Item, I Give and bequeath unto
my Daughter Mary Sturby one Negro
Girl named Betty,

Item I Give and bequeath unto my
daughter Deborah Sturby one Negro
Boy named Billy, of the said Boy I do
shout give her sound and sensible
for my life if the Bench Judge should
have an other issue that my Daughter
Deborah should have said child

Item, I Appoint my Beloved friend
John Thayer, Esq. Sturby, Thomas Glen
and my son John Sturby my lawful
Executors My Will & be it is that my Effects
be disposed of three hundred and fifty
pounds of land on Back Road known by the
name of John Willey

the purpose of paying and discharging
my Just debts that may be due at the
time of my decease of said lands ap-
pelled and disposed of in the different
quarters all claims that as lawfully
my Will and be it that my son
be conducted by my Exrs to or to discharge
finally also demand against me and the
disposal of the same to take place the
last demand in equity settled,

Then all my Estate shall be given
to be disposed of by the discretion of
my Executors that is to say all the
part of said Estate
