But of perfect mind and Memory thanke be Given to God
The same therefore Calling to mind the mortality
of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for
all men once to die I therefore Recommend my Soul
unto the hands of God that have it Not Doubting but
I shall Receive the same at the General Resurrection
And as for my body I Recommend it to the Earth to be
Buried in a Christian Like and Decent manner at the
Discretion of my Executors and as for my worldly Estate
I Give and be Queath in manner and form following
Item I Give and be Queath to my Eldest Son John Phillips
all and singular my Land and Tenements together with
head of Brown Cattle and one feather bed and furniture
Item I Give and be Queath unto my will be Loved

Son Demise Lawrence head of Brown Cattle and one
feather bed and furniture and one mare Called fly
and back of my said Son one Iron pot appare

Item I Give and be Queath to my well beloved wife
Ester the one halfe of the rest of my Estate
and the Rest to my Daughter ann, to be Equally
Devided between ^{them} after my Just Debts and
Funerall Charges be paid and fully Satisfied
and I do Link ways Constitute my wife as an Executrix
and my Brother Stephen Phillips as an Executor

With hir and his executors and Revoke all other wills
and Testaments by me before made Ratifying and
~~Confirming~~ allowing this to be my Last will and tes-
tament in witness Where of I have here unto set
my hand and Seal
