be to Almighty God for the same) do this September 20th Day of March in the Year of
our Lord 1808 and Seven hundred & Ninety two make and publish this my last
Will and Testament; in manner following (that is to say) I give to my
Daughter Dicey M^r. Daniel and her Heir the Plantation & Land whereon I now
Dwell. Item I give to my two Daughters Sarah Clark and Ann Thorne the remain
part of my Land to be equally divided among them or their Heir
I give unto my Daughter Dicey M^r. Daniel two Negroes Namely Tony and Lucy,
Item, I give unto my Daughter Sarah Clark two Negroes named Dick & Daniel
Item, I give to my Daughter Ann Thorne two Negroes named Bob & Peggy.
It is my Will that my Daughter Dicey's Negroes as well as my other two Daughters
Negroes be raised by three reputable Freeholders and whatever they shall think my
Daughter Dicey's Negroes shall be worth less than either of my other Daughters
Negroes (above named) my Daughter Dicey shall be allowed to take out of my other
Personal property before there be any Division made thereof. I give unto my
Daughter Sarah Twenty five Pounds to be taken out of my other Personal property,
also before any Division be made. The remainder of my Moveable property 'tis my
Will that it be equally Divided among my three Daughters or the surviving part of them or
their Heir. And 'tis my further Will also that if any of my aforesaid Daughters
should Die without Heir or an Heir that her or their share shall be equally divided
among the surviving part or their Heir or Heir. And I hereby do constitute &
appoint my son William G. Reeves to be my Executor to this my

of Cumberland County in the State of North Carolina
being weak in body but of sound mind and memory
(thanks be to Almighty God for the same), do this seventeenth
day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and ninety two, make and publish this my
last Will & Testament in manner following, that is
to say, Imprimis. I give to my daughter Dicy McDaniel
and her heirs the Plantation & Land whereon I now
dwell, Item. I give to my two daughters Sarah Clark
and Ann Warner the remaining part of my lands to be
equally divided among them or their heirs
I give unto my daughter Dicy McDaniel two negroes
namely, Joney and Lucy, Item. I give to my

daughter Sarah Clark two negroes named Dick & Daniel Item - I give to my daughter Ann Warner two negroes named Rob & Pegg. In my will that my daughter Diez's negroes as well as my other two daughters negroes be valued by three respectable freeholders and whatever they shall think my daughter Diez's negroes shall be worth less than ~~either~~ either of my other daughters negroes above named, my daughter ^{Diez} shall be allowed to take out of my other personal property before there be any division thereof - Item - I give unto my daughter Sarah twenty five pounds to be taken out of my other personal property also before any division be made the remainder of my moveable property, in my will that it be equally divided among my three daughters or the surviving part of them or their heirs, and it is my further will also that if any of my aforesaid daughters should die without heirs or an heir that her or their share shall be equally divided among the surviving part or their heirs or heir, And I hereby again constitute and appoint my son in Law William M Daniel to be my executor to this my last will and Testament

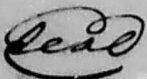
