

Stephen Pegrain of the County of
Cumberland and State of North Carolina
being of sound mind but weak in body
and considering the uncertainty of my earthly
existence do make and declare this my last
will and testament in manner and form
following that is to say.

Item 1st. My will and desire is that my executor
herein after named shall provide for my body
a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my
relations and friends pay all funeral expenses
and collect all debts however and by
whomsoever owing and pay all of just debts
out of the money that may first come into
his hands as a part of my estate.

Item 2nd. My will and desire is that my
brother Geo. W. Pegrain shall take care of my
mother and that my mother shall have
my negro slave Dickey during her nat-
ural life to be disposed of as my mother
may see proper. The land whereon
now lies has been willed to my mother
during her natural life by my father
Wm. Pegrain deceased which life estate she
now holds but or her relinquishing
her life interest in the land or at her
death ~~according to the~~ to the ^{for} my will
and desire is that my beloved wife
Caroline Pegrain shall have during her
natural life or widowhood that part
of my land including all of my im-
provements beginning at the mouth of
the marsh branch running then up
the various courses of Parkers creek to a
lawn, as the dividing branch ^{they} ^{up} ~~to~~ ^{from} ^{the} ^{back}

line at the corner known as Leeches corner then west along the back line
~~while said line~~ to the marsh branch then down the various courses of said branch to the beginning.

Item 3rd I give and devise to my two sons James William Pogram and David Alexander Pogram the balance of my land to be equally divided between them and also the portion of land left to my wife on her marriage or at her death shall also be equally divided between my two sons

Item 4th I give and devise to my beloved wife my negro slave Maria and her youngest child Harriet as her property.

Item 5th I give and devise to my son James W. Pogram one half of the following negroes viz Elizabeth Garrett Wesley Betty and Warren when he shall arrive at the age of twenty one years the negro to be assessed and equally divided.

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my son David A. Pogram the other half of the negroes named in the 5th Item to them and each of them and to their heirs for ever.

Item 7th My will and desire is that my beloved wife Caroline Pogram shall have the care and use of the negroes named in the 5th Item until the division shall take place named above and that my wife shall provide for the education of my two children

Lunes, W. Pegram and David, A. Pegram,
Item 8th I Give and devise to my beloved
wife one black geldin four years old and
spring and also on my mothers relinquish-
ing her life right to the stock of
cattle I give to my wife four cows and
calves her chairs two saws and pigs -
one bureau one bookcase one bed and
bedslid and its necessary furniture her
chairs one fall leaf table one small
table one set of shoe chairs one
trunel bed stick one set of split
bottom chairs one set of knives
and forks all of the crackery were
of every description farming tools of
every kind two spiders one small pot
one large pot the stock of provisions
on hand and also the growing crop
thirty bushels of wheat and twelve dry hogs.
Item 9th My will and desire is on my
mothers relinquishing her life interest in
the other property or at her death ^{it} shall
be sold and the proceeds equally divided
between my two children Lunes, W. Pegram
and David A. Pegram.

Item 10th My will and desire is that who
ever shall remain after paying my
debts ^{out of} what is due me that it shall
be applied to the education of my chil-
dren

Item 11th I Give and devise to my beloved
wife one buggy and harness

Then I do hereby appoint my
swarthy brother Genl. W. Pegram
my lawful executor to execute this my
last will and testament to all intents
and purposes.
