Elizabeth Walker - greatly

In the name of God Amen. I William L. Walker of the County of Cumberland and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory Considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. That is to say first that my Executor (herein after mentioned) shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends and pay all funeral expenses. Together with all my just debts however and to whomsoever owing out of the money first coming into his hands as a part of parcel of my Estate Item I give and bequeath to my son Alexander Walker two hundred acres of land Joining his own whereon he now lives and Joining the lands formerly belonging to Seaborn Morrison. Also one negro man named Sandy and one girl named Fanny I give and bequeath to Alexander Brown son of Alexander Walker Two hundred and fifty acres of land Joining Thompson and Williams I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Walker one hundred acres of land whereon I now live together with all my household and kitchen furniture also all my farming tools and other tools of every description also one hundred acres of land Joining the same known as the old Canna land also Four hundred and eight acres adjoining Thompson and the land formerly McLeans also Fifty acres Joining the same and the tract on which I live also one Negro Woman Jane and her children name Harry Peter Charles Charlotte Sophiah Zilpha Sam Lewis & David also my Horses and Stock of every kind consisting of Cattle sheep and Hogs also three shot guns and one rifle also all the crop that may be on the plantation at the time of my death also all the provisions that may be on hand at that time I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah Bethea Widow of John Bethea Decd. the sum of ten dollars I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Hargrove wife of Isaac Hargrove the sum of ten dollars I will and direct that my daughter Elizabeth shall pay to my Executor

as much as it may take to defray my funeral charges Just debts and ten dollars to each of my other daughters Hannah and Jerusha I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend James A. Thompson my lawful Executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last Will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made in Witness whereof I the said William L. Walker do hereunto set my hand and Seal this 1st day June 1841.

Signed sealed published and declared by the said William L. Walker to be his last will and testament in presence of us who at his request in his presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto
