

The last will and testament of Williamson Whitehead
of Grayville, North Carolina:

I appoint my friends Thomas J. Curtis, and Samuel T.
Stanley, the Executors of my last will and testament:
I give and bequeath unto my wife Janet Whitehead,
~~my house, garden, and lot on Hospital street,~~ for the term
of her natural life: - also to her absolutely on her own
right all my Household and Kitchen furniture, one Horse
and Cart, Cartage, Stock of Cattle, and the sum of
\$12. Thousand dollars, for the support of myself
and family for one year, to be paid forthwith by my execu-
tors: -

I authorize and direct my Executors afterward, for the pur-
pose of the payment of my debt, and the division of my
estate, to sell, or otherwise dispose of, by leasing for a term of
years, all my real estate, at their discretion; applying the
proceeds thereof to the intent of the estate, and the benefit
of my wife and children, to the payment of my debt, in
proportion to, or equally with the personal estate; except that I
wish the stock in trade, and the debt due me, so applied in
the first place: - giving them however, in the sum of
one thousand dollars, or the one who may qualify, and act, full, and
ample power, and authority, to sell, and make titles, to
my said real estate, if in their opinion, it should seem
proper and necessary: -

After the payment of my debt, and the bequests aforesaid
unto my wife, I give, devise, and bequeath unto my wife
Janet Whitehead, and my three children, Elizabeth, William
and Caroline, all my property and estates, of every kind
real, and personal, to be divided, into four equal parts
share, and share ~~the~~, equally, to them and their heirs
forever: -

The Last Will and Testament of Williamson Whitehead

the same was duly proven by the oath of Augustus Steele, one of the
Subscribing witnesses to the same, who also proved the hand
writing of the subscribing witness Samuel R. Blake, and that
the same was signed in his presence at the request of the Testator.

The Codicil to said Will annexed was duly proved by the oath
of John W. Dobbins, one of the subscribing witnesses thereto.
Ordered to be recorded - Samuel T. Stanley and Thomas J.
Curtis the Executors named qualified as such and Letters
Testamentary granted.
