God that give it and my body I do commend to the Earth to be
buried in a Christian like manner at the direction of my God
and as Teaching such worldly Estate where with it has pleased
God to Bless me in this life I give Disposition of the same
in the following manner and form
Item first of all I send the Use of all my lands to my well
belov'd wife during her life or Widowhood and at her decease
or ~~marriage~~ Marriage all the afo^d said lands to be equally
Divided amongst all my ~~children~~ now in being Namely Frank
John Ogden and the Child my wife is now pregnant with if
it is a boy Given to them and their heirs forever
Item I also send the Use of all my Moveable property to
my afo^d Wife during her life or Widowhood and if she dies
that she can pay any of the afo^d property after paying
my landfull Debts for her to sell whatever is convenient
for the support of my Children or to give them schooling
and at her death or Marriage to be equally Divided amongst
all my Daughters Namely Sarah Elizabeth & Comfort and
if the Child my Wife is now pregnant with it a girl
Child to have its Equall part with the above three Girls also
I do hereby constitute make and ordain my Friend & brother
Melachi Jones and Jacob Litchfield my whole and sole Ex^{ors}
to this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have
at my bed and seal this seventh day of December in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety four

In the Name of God Amen I Abraham Litchfield of the State of New Carolina
and County of Currituck being in reasonable health and of sound and disposing
mind and memory but calling to mind the Mortality of my body do make
and my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following
Item first of all I give and bequeath my soul to God and as to such worldly Estate
where with it hath pleased God to Bless me I give Disposition of it
in the following manner and form Viz^d
I leave to my Wife Mary Litchfield the use of all my lands during
her Natural life
Item I give to my two Daughters Army and Mary Litchfield all my lands to be equally
divided between them, beginning at the N^over side and running to the exterior part
of my land so as to divide the Plantation equally between them as well as
the woodland that is to say the Southernmost part to my Daughter Army
and the Northernmost part to my daughter Mary and their heirs for
ever Item I give to my two daughters Army and Mary my March
to be equally divided between them to them & their heirs for ever
Item I leave the use of all my Personal Estate to my wife Mary
Litchfield during her Natural life & after her decease to be equally
divided between my two Daughters Army and Mary to them and
their heirs. Lastly I do hereby Nominate constitute and appoint
my Wife Mary Litchfield Executrix of this my last Will and Testament
and hereby resolving and Disannulling all former Wills heretofore by
me made ratifying and Confirming this and other to be my
last

recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial
at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at
the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by
the mighty Power of God and at touching such worldly
estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
I give devise, and dispose of the same in the following
Manner and Form.

First I give and Bequeath to my dearly Beloved Wife Comfort How
all my land Containing two hundred and fifty Acres and
all my Cattle Beasts except ~~two~~ one Cow and calf
that I give to Mary How, also my Sheep to my Wife Comfort
How except twelve head six head of Sheep I give to
Joseph and six head of Sheep I give to James Williams
all my hogs two sows one year old barrows and nine hogs
I give to my Wife Comfort How also I give unto Ezekiel Hooper
my boat and oars and main sail and jib likewise I give to
my Wife Comfort How my house household goods &c

and Moveables and one horse, also give to Rejiah How one
Bed and furniture Likewise I give unto John How one
Shilling also I give unto William How one Shilling
Likewise Constitute make and ordain Ezekiel Hooper
and my Wife Comfort How my Executors of this my
last Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disavow
revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments
with Legacies Bequests and Executors by me in any way
before made, willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my last Will and Testament I
Witness whereof I have hereunto set hand and seal this
seventy sixth day of December in the Year of our Lord
one thousand seven hundred and Ninety five
