nearly sick but in perfect mind and memory thanks  
be to allmighty God I make and ordain this my  
last will and testament first of all I give to my  
daughter Nancy the bed and furniture wherow  
I slept also I give to my daughter Lucy my  
other bedd and furnature Then after paying  
my debts all the rest of my property to be  
equally devideed between my two daughters  
Nancy Walker and Lucy Walker Ratifying  
thus to see my last will and no other this  
my ach the 18 in the year of our Lord 1823

The last will and Testament of Andrew Bates  
Filed exhibited and Proved August term 1823

In the name of God amen I Andrew Bates of the County  
of Currituck and State of North Carolina being of a sound  
perfect mind and memory blessed be God for the same do  
this twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and twenty three do make and publish  
this my last will and testament in manner & form following  
that is to say

First After all my just debts is paid I send the use of  
all my estate both land and perishable property except  
the lot or house where Mrs Amey Haynes lives which I  
shall hereafter mention, unto my wife

during her life, for her and my children support and  
for my children to be educated out of my estate at the  
discretion of my wife as soon as the two boys is large  
enough and my wife thinks proper I want them both  
put to some good trade and at the death of my wife  
I give and bequeath the whole of my estate unto my  
four children to be equally divided between them  
to them and their heirs forever and I leave for my  
wife to sell the following marsh and precision  
beginning at those Brunnells Eastward line thence a  
strake course to the southwest River it being all that  
I own from the said line to the land I sold before Lee  
I leave Mrs Amey Haynes the following land during  
her life by paying sea dollars per year after the expira-  
tion of five years from this date, beginning at a Pine  
at the Eastward side of the place she now lives on -  
at the main road running a northerly course one  
hundred yards, thence a strake course to those Brunnells  
line long Brunnells line to the main road thence  
down the road to the first station -

And I hereby make and ordain my wife Amey  
Bates executrix of this my last Will and Testament  
in witness whereof I the said Andrew Bates have to  
this my last will and testament set my hand and  
seal the day and year above written
