

The Last Will and Testament of John Fisher Sen decd was Exhibited in open Court at February Term 1833 and proven by the Oaths of Carlwright Bell and Genl M McLean witnesses thereto the Executor therein named Custified and ordered to be Recorded

In the name of God amen I John Fisher Sen of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina being in a sound mind and memory and in good health blessed be God do this fourteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven make and constitute and publish this my last will and testament in manner following viz -

First I resign my soul to almighty God who gave it and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner in the burying ground in my old plantation & my wife and slave the said burying ground should be kept as a family burying ground & be considered not the property of any one individual and that any part of my property hereafter given away shall be subject for the tax of any demanded

Item I Give the use of all of my goods and chattles rights & credits lands and tenements belonging at this time to me to my wife Lydia during her widowhood or life

Item I Give and bequeath to my son John my daughter Roseman and my daughter Polly all that land & tenements that I purchased of Joseph Summers bounded by the lands of Joshua Taylor Holwell Fishers & my old plantation to be divided by lines running from the main road to the water shore and share alike the north lot to daughter Polly the middle share to my son John and the third lot to my daughter Roseman after the marriage or death of my wife Lydia to them & their heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my daughter Peggy three and half acres of land to be laid off out of my old plantation & woods on the north side to run across my old plantation tract paralleled with the Summers tract line after the marriage or death of my wife Lydia to her & her heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca three acres of land to be laid off out of my old plantation tract in the same manner as Peggy after the marriage or death of my wife Lydia to her & her heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my daughter Sally three acres of land to be laid out of the old plantation tract adjoining my daughter Rebecca in the same manner after the marriage or death of my wife Lydia to her & her heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy three acres of land to be laid off out of the old plantation tract adjoining my daughter Sally and in the same manner after the marriage or death of my wife Lydia to her & her heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Christopher Fisher an dollar to him and his heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to the heirs of my son Holwell one dollar to them and their heirs forever

Item I Give to my daughter Polly fifty dollars in cash to be paid after the marriage or death of my wife Lydia to her & her heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my son John my daughter Roseman & my daughter Polly all the remainder of my lands & tenements & goods & chattles rights & credits not heretofore given away to be equally divided between them share & share alike after the marriage or death of my wife Lydia to them & their heirs forever

Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my beloved wife Lydia and my son John Executors & Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said John Fisher Sen have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day & year above

The Last Will and Testament of Amos Hutchins decd was Exhibited in open Court at Feb'y Term 1832 and proven by the Oaths of William Hutchins and Sally Banks subscribers thereto and ordered Recorded the Executor qualified

In the name of God amen I Amos Hutchins do this twenty eight day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty one do make and declare this instrument of writing to be my last will & testament in manner as follows

Item 1. I Give and bequeath to my son John William Hutchins's son Lepta Hutchins all of my land that I own and possess namely the plantation whereon I now live supposed to be forty seven acres bounded as follows viz on the south by Samuel Gordon and on the east by Samuel McFarley & William Hutchins & on the north by the main road and on the west by Abner Boyer also a piece of Swamp bounded as follows viz on the east by the head Swamp road on the north by Abner Boyer on the west by

by Edmund Sawyer and on the South by the lands formerly
Peter Gregory's supposed to be fifteen acres minor left
alles one Negro Boy named Frederick about twelve
or fifteen years old or thereabouts alles all of notes note
and all of my stock and all of my ^{household} ~~household~~ ^{personal} ~~personal~~ ^{effects} ~~effects~~ ^{that I}

In the name of God amen I James Douglas Being very sick and weak but in perfect mind and memory thanks be to God calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is now appointed for all men to dy, as it has pleased god to bless me with my worldly good I dispose of them in the following manner That is to say I give unto my son James Douglas my land where I now live also the Privilege of the Walker Land five years for rail timber five hundred each year also to have the rails that is now split there also a feather bed and furniture also one cow and calf also one sow & pig also two head of sheepe also one gun -

Below I give unto my son Antony Longley the Land that I
bought of Luis Dagers and Thos Williams, also one feather
head and furniture also yoke of steers, wheel car
also one cow and calf a cow & piglet also three head of sheep
also one gun

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Below I give to my daughter Nancy Banglaff the
land that I bought of Samuel Walker also one feather
bed & furniture also to my daughter Nancy Cop
line dollars and no more also to my son Marke
Banglaff five dollars and no more also to my daughter
Betsey Foster ten dollars and no more also Sally Bager
ten dollars and no more also Polly Walker ten dollars
and no more those gifts to be paid in two years after
deces also after paying my just and lawful debts
the remainder of my property I give to my wife
Mary Banglaff I wish James Banglaff and Anthony
Banglaff and Nancy Banglaff to take possession of
these properties at my deces Relieving this to be
my last will and testament signed published then
February the tenth day 1833 his

Paymer Daughter of Francis Paymer all my Property with
out doors to be possess and Equally divid between
them and I do further by this present ^{Second} ~~ordain~~ all other wills
or wills by me made and acknowledge this my last will &
testament & I do constitute ordain & appoint my son Charles
Taylor my whole & sole Executor in witness hereof I have hereunto
