

In the name of God, (AMEN). I Thomas Farrow of the county of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being sick and weak of body, but of sound disposing mind and memory, blessed be the almighty god for its calling to mind the sure certainty of this life and its being ordained once for all people to die, I do make and ordain this instrument of writing to contain my last will and Testament, disannulling and revoking all other wills and Testament heretofore made by me either by word or writing, and this only to be taken as my last will and Testament. First, that is to say, I recommend my soul to (Almighty) God that gave it, & my body to be decently in a christian like manner, buried in a place where it may please my executor hereafter named, and as to what worldly estate it shall please god to bestow on me far above my deserts, I give and dispose in manner and form as follows. First. I gave and bequeath unto my son Miles Farrow and my son Ignatious Farrow my two plantations on Mathamustreet to be equally divided between them two, and my son Miles Farrow to have the plantation where Ambrose Long now lives, and my son Ignatious Farrow to have the plantation where John Neal lives, it is my will and desire that my two sons before mentioned should pay unto my two youngest daughters Elizabeth Farrow and Asenath Farrow fifty dollars per year for sixteen years, each son to pay twenty five dollars yearly. I also gave unto my son Miles Farrow fifty acres of land joining Silas Farrow's eastern line. I also gave unto my little daughter Asenath Farrow fifty acres of land joining Miles Farrow's eastern line, and Sarah Neal westward line to her and her heirs forever. I gave unto my little grand son Joseph Farrow thirty acres of land, where Jacob Williams formerly lived joining James Neal's eastern line, to him and his heirs forever. I gave unto my son Asa Farrow forty six acres and two thirds of land joining John Farrow's southern line, being part of the land my father formerly lived on, to him and his heirs forever. I gave unto my daughter Elizabeth Farrow seventy five acres of land where Thomas Bradley now lives, to her and her heirs forever. I gave unto my daughter Scamay Farrow seventy five acres of land joining the land that I gave to my daughter Elizabeth Farrow, where Thomas Bradley now lives, running to the north of Elizabeth Farrow's land, to her and her heirs forever. Also, I gave unto my daughter Elizabeth Farrow my horse & land whereon I now live, containing ninety eight acres to her and her heirs forever, & the house to be moved on Miles Farrow's land, that joins Silas Farrow's land. I gave all the rest of my land to be equally divided between my two sons Miles Farrow and Asa Farrow to them and their heirs forever. I also gave unto my son Miles Farrow

one negro man by the name of Joseph to him and his heirs forever. I also gave unto my son Asa Farrow one negro woman by the name of Rachel to him and his heirs forever. I also gave unto my daughter Elizabeth Farrow one negro girl by the name of Malagie to her and her heirs forever. I also gave unto my little daughter Asenath Farrow one negro man by the name of Quay; also one negro woman by the name of Varney, to her and her heirs forever. I also gave unto my little grand son Joseph Farrow one negro boy by the name of Jacob, to him and his heirs forever. I also gave unto my two youngest daughters Elizabeth Farrow and Asenath Farrow one negro girl by the name of Dorcas to them and their heirs forever. It is also my will & desire that my schooner boat should be sold, and all my just debts to be paid out of the money arising from the sale of said boat. After all my just debts and funeral charges is paid, then I gave all the rest of my property then remaining to be equally divided among all my children as before mentioned. I do also constitute make and appoint my son Miles Farrow and my friend John Clark executors to this my last will and Testament, to settle this my estate according to law, as witness my hand and seal this 31st day of January, in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen.

In the name of God, (AMEN). I Anthony Simmon of the county of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being sick of body, but of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, in manner and form as follows. In the first place, I lend to my daughter Hester Vandover one piece of land bounded as follows, beginning at mine and Cornelius Moore's corner on the road and running down the road two hundred yards, then a parallel course with Mercer's line until it comes to my son's line hereafter mentioned, to her my said daughter Hester during her life, and after her death, I give the said land to the children of my said daughter Hester. I also give to my daughter Hester thirty six dollars, to be paid her out of my estate. Then I lend to my daughter Sarah Jarvis one piece of land beginning at a small red oak well known by my family, then running about a south east course or about down the branch between the road and Ackland's Island to James Whitcomb's line, then up his and Samuel Forber's line runs northly, and so up to the land I have given my grand daughter Polly St. Cavenier and to the road and as the road runs to the beginning red oak, all that part northly and eastwardly of the first mentioned line, to her my daughter Sarah Jarvis I lend the said piece of land during her life, and after her death, I give said land to the heirs of my said daughter Sarah Jarvis. Then I give all the remainder of my lands to my son Anthony Simmon.

I also give unto my son Anthony Simmons all my negroes after his mother's death, also I give unto my son Anthony, all my farming tools and one bed and furniture, and one stock of bees. Item. I lend to my daughter Hester Vandover one pided heifer during her life, and after her death I give said heifer and all her increase to the heirs of my daughter Hester. Item. I lend to my daughter Sarah Jarvis one red heifer during her life, and after her death I give said heifer and all her increase to my said daughter Sarah's children, also I give unto my daughter Sarah Jarvis one stock of bees that is at her house already. Item. I lend unto my daughter Hester Vandover one stock of bees, and after her death I give the same and their increase to the heirs of my said daughter Hester. Item. I lend unto my beloved wife the use of all my negroes during their life, also the use of a piece of land beginning at the main road opposite a large black Mulberry tree by the grave yard, to my daughter Hester's line all the land and buildings to the south of said course next to James Whitehurst's, to go about worst course from the main road. Item. I give unto my son Anthony one mare colt. Item. I give unto my grand daughter Polly S. Cavender thirty six dollars to be raised out of my estate. My request is that my executor and executor hereafter named, sell such part of my estate (not already given away) as may be necessary to pay my just debts and funeral charges and no more. I also give unto my beloved wife, my son Anthony and my two daughters Hester Vandover and Sarah Jarvis all the remainder of my estate not already given away to be equally divided between them, each party to choose one person to appraise and divide the same. Lastly, I nominate and appoint my beloved wife and my son Anthony executor and executor to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day of May 1815.

First of all I wish that all my just debts be paid out of my estate. Item. I give and bequeath unto Caleb Toler my grand son one feather bed and furniture. Item. I give unto the deacons of Bowdell's Point baptist church twenty dollars to be laid out by them for the support of the Ministry to be raised out my estate. Item. I give unto Matthias Toler my grand son twenty dollars to be laid out on schooling of said child. Item. I give unto Matthias Davis my grand son one case and calf. Item. My will and desire is that all my property that I have not already given away be sold by my executor, and also my just debts is paid all the remainder part of the money, to be equally divided amongst all my children, to wit James Toler, Sally Chaplin and Polly Thrudge and last of all I make and appoint my friend Simon Sawyer my executor to this my last will and Testament. I Simon Matthias citizen of Currituck county and State of North Carolina, do make and ordain this instrument of writing to be my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth Viz. I lend my daughter Abi Dorey one negro girl by the name of Love during her natural life, and after her death I give and bequeath said negro Love to be equally divided amongst all my daughter Abi's children. I give and bequeath to my daughter Abi Dorey one red and white cow and her yearling also one year and lamb, one hand mill and chest that she now has. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Frankie Matthias one bed and furniture and one negro girl, by the name of Amey and also one linen wheel to her, and her heirs forever. Item. I lend to my beloved wife Elizabeth Matthias all the remainder of my property real, personal and chattle, after paying my just debts, during her widowhood. Item. I lend to my daughter Frankie Matthias after the death of her mother, during the time she shall live a single life the use of a part of my plantation as followeth Viz. beginning a ditch near the gate, then running down the ditch
