A Noncapitive will of Samuel Whitehurst, dec<sup>d</sup>, made in his last sickness, in his own house, as follows. November the day 1814. Item. It is my will that my wife Frances Whitehurst shall have half his gang of 24 dined hogs, to her, and her heirs forever. Item. It is my will that my son Gideon Whitehurst, and my son Samuel Whitehurst shall have my hand mill, that is on Indian ridge at Gideon Whitehurst's, to them and their heirs forever. Item. It is my will that my son Enoch Whitehurst and my son Peter Whitehurst shall have my hand mill, that is at home an east ridge, to them and their heirs forever.

I Benjamin Russell of the county of Cumberland and State of North Carolina being weak in body, but of a sound disposing mind and memory, calling to mind, that it is appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form as follows. First, I commend my soul to almighty God that gave it to me

Item. I lend unto my wife the house and plantation wherein I live during her natural life or widowhood, and one negro woman named Fathina, and one boy, Lam, and girl Grace, during her natural life or widowhood, on his keeping her two children, Susannah, and Daniel Russell, clear of any expense to keep. Item. I give to my wife one negro man, Job, two feather bed, and furniture, and all the iron ware and chairs and chests and table, to her, and her heirs. Also lend unto my wife after settling enough to pay my just debts, all of my valuable property during her widowhood. Item. I give unto my son Daniel Russell the plantation wherein I now live, and one boy by the name of George, to him and his heirs. — Item. I give unto my daughter Susannah, after the death or marriage of my wife, one negro woman by the name of Fathina, one boy by the name of Lam, one girl by the name of Grace, and all the rest of my estate within doors and without, to my daughter Susannah, I except the crop and hogs to go to my wife and her heirs. I do nominate my brother Daniel Quisenberry to be my whole and sole executor to ship my last will and Testament, and to impower him to act as he may think best for my children. In witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this, the 17th of November, 1814.

My will is that my two last sons John Davis and William Davis shall have all my land, if they live to be twenty one years of age, and if either of them die before he is twenty one years
