

I Give and bequeath to my Dearlly beloved son Bayella Jones all my land that I am Possesed with if in Case he dont Marry In his Wife or William Jones Daughter and if the said Bayella Jones a Widow of these last named Daughters I Give the said Land to my son John Jones also one Slave also one Horse also one Horse named Shubert, I Give and bequeath to my Dearlly beloved son Hazards Jones the three Horses of battle also five Head of Cattle also one Slave named Juvet also one Cow & Turnstone also one Cow I Give and bequeath unto my Dearlly beloved son John Jones one Bull named Moxant also one Cow and Turnstone also five Head of Cattle. I Give and bequeath to my Dearlly beloved Wife Sarah Jones all the Estate that was her before she was Married Except the Negroe Wintch Chain and What is made owing With the five Head of Sheep I Give and bequeath unto my son Bayella Jones three Head of Cattle also one Old Saddle I Give and bequeath unto my Wife Sarah Jones two Sows and Jordan Piggo also two large Hens I Give and bequeath unto my son John Jones all the Rest of my Negroe. I Give and bequeath to my Wife Sarah Jones one Negroe Wintch named Chain During her Life and Widdowhood if in Case she dont Remove here and stay here I Give to the two Horses to my son Bayella Jones Living here two white Children the first to be for three years John and the Next to his Mother John Jones and my Will is that the Remainses of my White Estate should be divided amongst my three Children viz Bayella and Ladocho and John Jones and Bayella and Ladocho they two shall pay all my Debts each one Paying an Equal Part out of their Several Legacies and I do Appoint my Wife Sarah Jones and my son Bayella Jones to be my two and Lawfull Executors and Disamulling all my Will with a power and I do Ordain this my last Will and Testaments On Witness where of I Have Here unto set my Hand to Seal 26 Day of December 1771.

North Carolina In the name of God Amen this 3^d Day of February 1772 the year of our Lord 1772, Benjamin Cox of Currituck County being my self and Wake both of sound and Perfect Memory, Men of the County of Currituck do hereby certify as follows to be my Last Will and Testaments in manner and form as followeth I Give and bequeath my soul unto Almighty God who gave it and in hopes of joyful Resurrection through Jesus Christ my blessed Redeemer. I Give and bequeath unto my son John Cox one Plantation and Land with thereon I was due to him and his Wife only I Give the one half of the Plantation and Land for my Widdowhood Anne Cox During her Natural Life or Widdowhood and also during the said son one Cow and Turnstone. I Give and bequeath unto my Wife Ann Cox one more Wintch one Negroe Baye called Juvet one Slave During her Natural Life or Widdowhood also one Horse called Toby one Cow and half one Cow & Turnstone four Head of Sheep one Pot and Run one Gun one Sea Battle and all my Plantations and Chines. I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Frances Cox two Head of battle that is in her market. I Give my Will and desire that if the said Negroe Wintch should Not live each of my Children in a Negroe Child at my Wifes Death I Give one Negroe by Name unto my Daughter Frances Cox also my Will and desire is that it might be as before Entommaraging that the said Wintch Febe and Negroe Baye should be Equally Divided between my two Daughters Mary Cox and Frances Cox Also I Leave my Cattle that I have Not already Given away and one young Horse as

a Betty negro to be sold to pay my Debt, and also Give unto my
son John all my Carpenter Tools excepting some Adams and
hook knives. Item, I Give unto my wife Ann the one Cow
I own and appoint my said Wife Ann Cox & Jonathan Jackson
Whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
