

The last will and testament of Caleb Capps Senr Decd
Exhibited and proved at Sept Term 1823

In the name of ammen the fiftenth day of august
In the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty
three I Caleb Capps of the State of North Carolina and County
of Currituck being in a low state of health but of a perfect sound
mind mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God first
have a mind to make this my last will and testament in
Manner and form following first I give my soul to the Lord
who gave it and my body to be buried in Christianlike
manner at the discretion of my executors and my worldly
goods manner and form following

first I lend all my lands and plantations wherein I now
live to my well beloved wife Elizabeth Capps during her
natural life or widow hood, by superseding my daughter
Franky clear of charge and should my wife Elizabeth
die before my daughter Franky comes to the age of fifteen
I leave my land to be rented out by my Executors for
support of my daughter Franky Capps while she is
under fifteen years of age and after I give all my lands and
plantations to be equally divided between my two daughters
Polly Capps and Franky Capps to them and their heirs and
assigns forever — Item I give and bequeath to my son Dennis
Capps one dollar in cash to him and his heirs forever

Item I give all the remainder of my estate after my just debts
and funeral Expenses is paid and after the death of my wife
Elizabeth Capps to my daughter Franky Capps to her heirs forever
I nominate constitute and appoint my well beloved wife
Elizabeth Capps and Andrew Capps whole and sole
Executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof

I the said Caleb Capps have hereunto set my hand and
caused my seal to be fixed the day and year above written

The Last will and testament of Dorcas Capps Decd
Exhibited and proved at Sept Term 1823

In the name of God Ammen We the Justices of the County of
Currituck and State of North Carolina do make and ordain this
my last will and testament bearing of sound mind but low
in Health in year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred
and twenty three on July the 9 as follows

Item I lend and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Nancy
White one negro man by the name of Harry also one piece
Wool and furniture also all of my sheep and cattle also
all of the bonds and notes of hands with all the cash
that I am in possession of at my death or that may be
due me on any other account also all of the household
furniture except one trunk and one chest to her own pro-
per use and benefit during her natural life and

should there be any thing left after her death I will
that it may be Equally divided between Caleb M
Bray and Lovey Bray and Thomas Bray or heirs of
Thomas Bray or heirs to them and their heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath unto Lovey Bray one trunk
to her and her heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto Betsy Harris one
chest to her and her heirs for ever

Item and lastly of all I am in and nominal Dennis
Simmons my personal and real Exor for this my last
will and testament as witness where unto I set my
hand and seal this the 9 day of July 1821 Sign Sealed
and delivered in the presence of us
