Item I Give and bequeath to my son John Heath one Negro woman  
named Jane and one feather bed and furniture and one bedstead and  
one of the new Cupboard and one Riding chair & Turned one Chair  
of Walnut and as many of my cattle to be at the value of  
Eighty Dollars and the money to go to my said daughter Susan  
to buy her a horse with if she thinks proper at six months time  
to her and her heirs for ever Item I Give and bequeath to my son  
Thomas Heath one feather bed and furniture and bedstead one  
oak Table and one Horse named Buck and one Negro woman  
belonging to her and to her heirs for ever Item I Give and  
bequeath to my Daughter Susan Heath one Dress and one  
linen which her first choice and five Barrels of Corn to her  
for ever Item I Give and bequeath to my Son and Daughter  
Julian Barnard one Blue Shirt and one Linen Sheet

Item I Give and Bequeath to my son John Heath one Oak  
Walnut Item I Give to my Daughter Nina Heath  
two Calico Gowns and one wood one I Give also all my daughter  
Susan Heath wearing apparel to my Daughter Nina Heath to have  
a part or two to be kept of as I have given to them and all my  
Coffee and Sugar that is in the house I Give to my son John Heath  
five Barrels of Corn I Give and bequeath to my son Thomas Heath  
all the remainder of my Corn which I Give and bequeath to my son  
also all the remainder of my estate  
and without his paying all my Debts  
I do now make constitute and appoint my wife  
whole and one cent of the only last will and Testament  
I have here unto in my hand and set to my seal this 12th Day of December  
in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and  
eighty last will and Testament in the presence of me Julian  
Heath

357 In the name of God I Charles Bradley of the County of Essex in my perfect senses and of a disposing mind do hereby certify and attest that I have given and bequeathed to my son John Bradley one lot and plantation called New Loc beginning at a pine standing on the side of the road and running by a line of barbed trees to well known bounds and my best bed and furniture and my best chest and trunk and one table. I have also bequeathed to my son Carter Bradley the track of land I bought of Walter Wenden and one half of the track of land I bought of Willm. C. Holt and my best bed and furniture. I have also bequeathed to my son John Bradley the track of land I bought of Zachariah Dodge and one half of the track of land I bought of Willm. C. Holt and one bed and furniture. I have also bequeathed to my Beloved wife Polly Bradley one lot and plantation one cow and calf and box of my best clothes including what is now wearing and all the things of my Estate I have been given in bequest after paying my lawful debts I give to my Beloved wife Polly Bradley during her widowhood and at her marriage the sum of \$1000 to be sold and the money raised from the sale to be equally divided between my son Carter and my son George. I also constitute and appoint my Beloved wife Polly Bradley my sole and sole executor of this my last will and testament. Resolving and discharging all my will and testaments before made ratifying and confirming this to be my my last will and testament (witness to the above) I have hereunto set my hands and fix my seal this 6 day of December 1809 in the presence of Demey Chace and George J. Bates my friends and neighbors.
