

The Last Will and testament of Daniel Lee
Deceased Exhibited and Proved at Feb'y Term 1893

In the name of God amen. I Daniel Lee
 of the County of Currituck and state of North Carolina
 being of a sound and perfect mind and memory
 blessed be God for the same do this twenty second
 day of Nov^r in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and twenty two do make and
 publish this my last will and testament in
 manner and form following, that is to say, I

First I give and bequeath unto my son Jesse Lee
 the land and plantation that I now live on and one
 other tract of Land beginning as follows beginning at the
 Meedy Branch down at the percusion running up the
 parrell ditch to Richard Floray line and thence to
 to a corner oak and thence along a cleared way
 where I intend to cut a ditch to Cutral line and
 thence along the branch to Hollowell Etheridge's line
 then up the s^d line to Collops Bunnells Land he
 bought of Wright thence acrop the road joining
 Tho^s Wrights land to the percusion thence along
 the percusion to the first station including both
 tracts and three negroes a negro man named King
 and negro launfort and Rachel and the negroes
 he has in his percusion to him and his heirs forever
 Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Long
 all the tract of Land she now lives on and the following
 negroes one negro man named Jam one woman Cindy one
 Girl Milbry and one negro woman she now has in her
 percusion to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Franky Bunn
 will one tract of Land called Sno grapes beginning at the
 corner oaks at Richard Floray line thence binding on the
 Land I gave to my son Jesse Lee thence binding on the
 Land of John Floray and thence to Richard Floray line

thence up the line to the first Station and also my share of the Cypress swamp and the following negroes one negro man Tom one woman Edy and one boy Peter and the negroes she has in her possession and one young Male to her and her heirs forever.

Item I lend the use and benefit of the following ^{Land} property to my Grand Daughter Eliza W. Ephson until she arrive to the age of eighteen then for the land to return to my heirs the land joining joining Richard Thorns, thence joining Millington West and joining Mitchell Scott thence bounding on the Ginney road to the road leads to Tull's breaks down the main road to the first station it being the residue of my land not willed away and in case she should marry under the age of eighteen or after then I give it to her and her heirs forever and also I will the following negroes the same way that I before willed the land one negro boy Pat and one negro girl Patsy and one Harriet and in case she should marry then I gave them to her and her heirs forever. I also give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter one cow & calf to her and her heirs forever.

The residue of my estate I gave to be equal divided between my three children hope Lee, Mary Louisa, Franky Bernall to them and their heirs forever.

Also my son Jesse Lee I leave to have the whole and sole care of the above legacies willed away to my Grand daughter Eliza W. Ephson until she marries for her use and benefit.

And I hereby make and ordain my son Jesse Lee executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said Scannell Lee have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

The Last will and testament of Collet Capps last Exhibited Nov term 1823

In the name of God Amen, I Collet Capps of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina do make and ordain this my last will and testament being of sound mind but low in health in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty three December the twelfth as follows

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Semiah Capps one negro woman named Hannah one heifer named Brit two cows and calves four Ewes, Eight head of hogs one feather bed and furniture, one chest and one safe and all belonging to it one iron pot one spinning wheel all the flax and cotton during her natural life or widowhood her first child in all these things.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved son William Capps seventy eight acres of Land whereon I now live, more or less binding on Stewart Williams & myself and Capps three negroes namely Tom, George and Pleasant and one half of my still and if he should die without lawful heir lawfully begotten by his two deys my will is that the said property go to my son Joel Capps.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joel Capps three negroes namely, Fanny, James & Frank two cows and calves, them half of the still Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Lydia nearly fifty dollars to be raised out of my Estate.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Rodah Waterfield fifty dollars to be raised out of my Estate. Lastly of all my will and desire is that after my husband Lawfull debts is paid that the residue of my property to be equally divided among all of my children and Grand Children and lastly of all I nominate and appoint my two sons William Capps & Joel my whole and sole Executor this my last will and testament signed sealed and delivered in presence of Collet Capps this 20th day of December 1820.
