The Last will and testament of Deborah
Loney Eschbestedd July Term 1832

In the Name of God Amen I Deborah Loney being
sick & weak in body & my sleep fluctuating, but perfect
in mind & memory as when in health thanks to my
God for the same & considering the uncertainty of life
think proper to make & ordain this to be my last
Will & Testament as followeth.

Item 1st I give & bequeath to John C. Lummous the
following Negroes, big Daniel, Nancy, Pleasant, Eliza
& Lamb but it is my request & desire that the said
John C. Lummous will admit said negroes to have the
result of their labour but ever to be under his
care & protection & his heirs forever.

Item 2^d I give & bequeath to Black Water meeting
House for its repair or towards the building of a
new one as the Church may think proper fifty
dollars to be retained in the hands of my Ex: without
Interest until the building or repairing of said Meeting
House be completed.

Item 3^c I give & bequeath to Maria Gusborn one negro
boy named Daniel, one Buffet crockery & glass, were
one Loom & harness, one Fuzz to be sold & the money
arising therefrom one bed & furniture one dog stool
Chairs, one blue Chest, also another bed & furniture
also one Mahogany Table one meat Wheel & one
Curing Wheel & $\frac{1}{4}$ of the net proceeds of my Estate
after paying all just debts & Legacies to her &
her heirs forever.

Item 4th I give & bequeath to Eliza Dozier one bed
& furniture 3rd choice to her & her heirs forever

Item 5th I give & bequeath to Susan Dozier one Bed
& furniture 4th choice to her & her heirs for-

ever.
Item 6th I give & bequeath to Brother in Law Dennis Loney
 $\frac{1}{4}$ of the money arising from my Estate after
paying all just debts & Legacies to him & his heirs forever

The Last Will and Testament of Willoughby Sawyer
Exhibited August Term 1832

In the name of God I Willoughby Sawyer of Cowluck County
being of sound and perfect mind and memory before be God
do this the 10 day of June in the year of our Lord 1832 make
and publish this my last will and Testament in manner
following that is to say

First I give and bequeath to my wife Lucy Sawyer all my land
on the Indian Ridge that is to say the Land I own with
all the privileges belonging thereto. I also give to my wife
one negro man by the name of Dempsey and one negro
woman by the name Linda I also bind to my wife
one negro girl by the name of Lemon till she shall
arrive to the age of 15 years I also give to my wife all my
house hold and kitchen furniture except one set of
tables silver spoons I desire for my daughter Coroline to have
when she arrives to age I also give to my wife her first
choice of my horses and my bigg and barren two milch
cows her choice I also give her corn and pork out of
my crop and stock to last her one year comfortable
I give and bequeath to my daughter Caroline Sawyer
one young negro man by the name of March one
negro woman by the name of Belony and Child by the
name of Mary the negro girl Lemon that I have
left to my wife till she comes to 15 years of age
I give to my daughter Caroline after the expiration
of the 15 years ~

I give and bequeath to my wife 10 head of sheep I desire
that my just debts to keep and care of the residue of my
money to go to my daughter Caroline Sawyer
I make and ordain my worthy friend Caleb Sawyer
Executor to this my Last will and Testament in
witness whereon I have set my hand and affixed
my seal

The Last will and Testament of Mitchell
Scott was exhibited at Cowluck May 2^r
1833 and proven by the son of Davis Batterson
a subscriber thereto in due form of Law
and this done Qualified and ordered to be recorded

In the name of God amen I Mitchell Scott of the County
of Cowluck and State of North Carolina being in a
good state of health but in my perfect senses and
disposing memory thanks be to god for it do make
constitute and ordain this my last will and test-
ament in manner and form as follows

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Scott the
tract of land adjoining my son Phillip and grand
son Samuel Scott containing Twenty nine acres
and three quarters also Two heads of which he has one
in possession on table and chest which he has in profession
one cow of which he has in profession

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Phillip Scott the land
where I live adjoining my land I give my son John &
Ben Timmons land containing Twenty nine acres & three
quarters to him and his heirs forever also one cow & calf
one horse one chest one folding Table one bofet one pair
of dog irons Two heads and furniture

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand son Samuel Scott
son of William Scott the land adjoining wills west
and the land I give my son John Scott the tract
containing Twenty nine acres & Three quarters and
if my grand son Samuel Scott should not
