The last will and Testament of Polly Cochran deceased
Exhibited and proved at November Term 1819

In the name of God, AMEN. I Polly Cochran of the county of Carrick and state of North Carolina, being sick and weak knowing the certainty of life and the certainty of death, do make this instrument of writing to be and contain my last will and Testament in manner and form following. Item. Give and bequeath to my daughter Abby Shudge two lots in the Alabama Territory, Clark county in the Town of Jackson, the lots are #110 & 111 on the north side of Franklin street (the above lots are now left in the care of Mr. William L. Pevis, I also give my daughter Abby a note of hand of twenty five dollars upon a man by the name of S. B. Bishop, which note was also left in the care of William L. Pevis, to her and her heirs forever. Item. A due bill on Charles Biles for seventy bushels salt, which due bill also left in the care of Wm L. Pevis citizen of the Town of Jackson, when said due bill is collected to be equally divided between all my children and their heirs forever. Item. All the rest of my property in Carrick of every description I leave to be sold, and after paying all my just debts, to be equally divided between all my children, namely, Nancy Campbell, Patsy Morris, John Gray, Polly Wilson, Sally Wilson and Abby Shudge, to them and their heirs forever. I also nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved son John Gray my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 7th. November one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

The last will and Testament of Mary Chittum dec^d
Exhibited November term 1819

In the name of God, amen. I Polly Chittum being sick and likely to die, but in perfect mind and memory, knowing his appointed time to die and death to judgment, and to be buried in a christian like manner. First. I give ~~and~~ to my beloved mother Winiford Chittum one house called Sentinell. Item. I give to my beloved brother John Chittum one feather bed and furniture, also one case of knives and forks —

Item. I give to my brother Peter Chittum one feather bed and furniture, half dozen windsor chairs, one chest. Give one riding chair and harness and all my cattle to be equally divided between my brothers John Chittum and Peter Chittum — Item. I give six dollars to be equally divided between William Lamb and his children Cornelius Lamb, William Lamb, Enoch Lamb, Gideon Lamb and Peter Lamb. & All the rest of my money to be equally divided between my mother Winiford Chittum and my brothers John Chittum and Peter Chittum I leave my brother John Chittum whole and sole executor to this my last will and Testament whereof I have set my hand and seal this 3^d day of April 1816. — Signed, sealed and delivered in presence of Charley Perkins Turel

The last will and Testament of Malachi Dudley dec^d exhibited
and proved at Carrick February term 1820

In the name of God, AMEN. I Malachi Dudley son of Carrick County and state of North Carolina, being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to Almighty God for it, and calling unto mind the mortality of man, and knowing it is appointed unto all men once to die, do take opportunity to dispose of my worldly goods in manner and form follows. First. I give my soul to the Lord who gave it, and my body to be buried in a christian like manner at the discretion of my executor, and my worldly goods as follows. Item. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mrs. Dudley all my lands and all of my stock and every particle of my household and kitchen furniture and every other article of property that I possess, either real or personal, after the payment of my just debts, to her and her heirs forever, that is lawfully begotten of her body. Item. I nominate, constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mrs. Dudley my whole and sole executrix to my last will and Testament, revoking and ~~making void~~ annulling all other former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused my seal to be affixed, the twenty first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen — Signed, sealed and delivered in presence of us.
