

The Last Will & testament of Dory Daug
deed proved August First 1831.
In the name of God Amen, I Dory Daug of
the State of North Carolina and County of Orange
being sick, but in perfect mind & memory thank
be to God for the same do make and ordain this present
ment of writing to be my last will & testament
first I command my soul to him that gave
it and my body to the earth as to my worldly
affairs I give and bequeath as follows viz
My Will & desire is that Angelico Daug to her one
feather bed & ~~one~~ chest and Elizabeth Daug
one feather bed and chest - Charlotte Daug one
feather bed and chest my will & desire is for the
beds to be divided so let them be valued &
then that draws the beds that is valued most
pay over to the others that I give unto them &
thus heirs forever - one half of earling cattle
heats Edmund Capps to him forever, all the
remainder part of my estate, lands & tenements
to be sold on a credit of six months forty
acres of land at Fresh Pond and after paying
all my just debts all the remainder part of my
estate to be equally divided between Angelico
Daug, Samuel Daug, Elizabeth Daug, Charlotte
Daug to them & their heirs forever. I leave
I appoint my trusty friend Thomas L. Land
my whole & sole executor of this my last will
& testament. To this I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this the 26th day of June 1831

Last Will & testament of John
Rodgers proved November First 1831
In the name of God Amen, I John Rodgers
now being low in health, but of sound mind
and memory and considering it is appointed
all men once to die do make & ordain
this my last will & testament. First it is my
will that all my just debts be paid after my decease
by my executor. Secondly I give to my son John
Rodgers one half of my boat Uthong to him &
his heirs forever Thirdly I give to son Durand
Rodgers one cow & calf and one gun to him &
his heirs forever. Fourthly I give to my son
Stephen Rodgers one gun - fifthly I give to my
son James Rodgers one gun Sixthly I give
my three sons Durand, Stephen & James Rodgers
all my land to be equally divided amongst
them to them and their heirs forever after the
death of my wife Mary Rodgers. Seventhly I
give to my wife Mary Rodgers the use of all
