The Last Will and Testament of James
Bray deceased, exhibited May term 1833

In the name of God amen. James Bray of the County
of Currituck and State of North Carolina being sick
and weak of body, but of sound disposing mind and memory
do make and ordain this my last will and testament to
give unto my wife Mary Bray one negro man named
Peter to her and her affianced. I lend to my wife Mary
Bray all my property within doors and without doors
during her widowhood. I give and bequeath unto
all my lawful heirs all my Land and Crement and
property of all kinds whatsoever belongs to me, to be equally
divided between them. I constitute, make and ordain
my wife Mary Bray Executor and my brother William
Bray my Executor to this my Last will and testament
Rescinding and making void all other wills, wills or
bequests whatsoever. In testimony whereunto I have
set my hand and seal the seventeen day of February
in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and twenty two

The Last Will and Testament of Mr David
Jones deceased Exhibited Feby 1st 1823.

In the name of God amen. I David Jones of the
County of Currituck in Carolina; weak in body, but
of sound mind, do make declare and pronounce
this to be my last will and testament. I command
my soul to be who created it my body to be buried
by the side of my former wife.

I bequeath to my wife Mary during her natural life or
widowhood, negro woman Lucy and her two youngest
children, Job and Tom, negro woman Rose & child little
also negro man Simon; and after her death the two
negro women and their children to be sold, and
the money equally divided between all my children;
the negro man Simon I give after the death of my
wife Mary to my son Joseph, Jacob, give to my
wife Mary forever, my home lot, Womble's Lair,
two bed and furniture, Bible, two tables, side board
looking glass, all the crockery ware and Kitchen furniture
Twenty two hogs first choice at the plantation called
Perkins, three barren plots called Sunny, two plots
house lot, roath of oxen at Lumbey, and negro girl
Lucy & thirty five barrels of corn.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Gribble
the plantation I now live in; upon Currituck. Also
and to which she resided after my death it being
her mother's maiden Land. I also give her negro boy Monk
one bed and furniture, secretary & book case, all my silver
spoons and watches & the bedding my wife started
To Dr. E. L. Gribble give his own note of one hundred and
eighty dollars or upwards, also all other debts he may
due me, also all my Medical books and stock of
medicine, Shop furniture instruments &c.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Bridget Elizabeth
the Land I bought of the Thompsons ever since I have
now lived and subject to his wife's Life Estate, also
my swamp land lying in buckhorn Swamp
Bkt of William Perkins containing about
three hundred acres, also the marsh down on
bills Island, also one bed and furniture, also two
boy Alexander and girl Phoebe and two hundred
dollars in notes of hand and I nominate Dr. E.
Gribble the guardian of said daughter B. Elizabeth

To my son Joseph Jacob Jones I give and bequeath
negro man Daniel, negro man Charles, boy Bush.
I also give to said son the tract of Land called Denby
lying in Gibbons wood all the tract adjoining it
called Argills these two tract contain seven or eight
hundred acres, also I give him the tract of Land I own
in Mozeek that I bought of Wilson its the third
of a tract of six or seven hundred acres together
with all my other Land not already given
away;

I desire that negro girls Maria and Sarah be sold
to the best advantage, it is also my will and
desire that all other parts of my estate not given
away be sold at vendue, the proceeds with my
notes, book debts and ready money I should
suppose would raise a sum of twenty hundred
dollars or thereabouts, out of this sum I desire
all of my just debts of which there are but few
and none of magnitude to be paid, and also
2 plain marble Slabs to be purchased out of said
sum at the head of each of my wives and the other
at my own. — all the balance or residue of
my estate not before given away give to son
Joseph Jacob Jones. It is my will that if either
of my children should die under aged or without
issue, that its share of Estate should go equally
between my surviving children or their heirs.
I own three quarter Sections of McCollay's Bounty
Land in the state of Illinois, which I also give
to my son Joseph. It is my will that my son
Joseph be well educated and study some of the
Liberal professions, if he is found to have talents
if not some mechanic art of the professions
should prefer the Law. I appoint General
James Beall his guardian with leave to sell part
of his Real estate, should it be necessary to complete
his studies — I appoint Thos B. Ferebee & Excoch
D. Ferebee executors to this my last will and
testament signed sealed and delivered in presence

The Last Will and Testament of
James Harris was exhibited. May term 1823
Know all men by these presents that James Harris
being in a bad state of health see make my last
will and testament — First I will that all my test
ments shall be prayed and next I will that my wife
Body shall have the privity of the house and
earthy end of my Land her life, but she shall not
rent it out against my son John will and me
I will and give unto my son John the hole of my
Land only my son Faddach will forsake the
presence and company of Body Wicker and if he
will forsake her I will that my son Faddach
shall have half of my land, I give one bed and
bedsted to my son John and I give one bed and
bedsted to my wife Body and I give one bed and
bedsted on the same condition of the land I gave
to my son Faddach and I give my gun to my
son John and I give to my wife Body one hundred
shillings and I leave my Cannon to be sold to
settle my debts and I likewise give unto my son John
one table, and I will that all that remains in the
House shall stand up it is until my wife death
and then to be taken down between my three
children — and this I acknowledge to be my last will
and testament duly the twenty fifth day of one
thousand eight hundred and twenty two

Delivered in presence of us
