along the Road to the first Station namely the Market Place -
I give and bequeath unto my son Michael Waterfield a certain
piece and tract of Land that I bought of Mr. Henry White
lying on the main road for or as it did when I bought it
of the said White to him and his heirs for ever

I give and bequeath unto my son John Waterfield a certain
piece and tract of Land where my son Abraham Waterfield
now lives bounded on the North by the line on the Eastward
& Northward sides on the Marsh on the Northward side
and on the lands I have give Michael on the south side

I give and bequeath unto my son Abraham Waterfield one
Negro Man named James to him and his heirs for ever

I give and bequeath unto my son William Waterfield one
Negro Man named Jack to him and his heirs for ever

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Esther Waterfield
one Negro Woman named Sarah to her and her heirs for ever

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Waterfield one
Negro Girl named Fanny to her and her heirs for ever

I give and bequeath unto my son John Waterfield one
Negro boy named Peter to him and his heirs for ever

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Waterfield
one Negro man named America to her and her heirs for ever

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Densley Wife of William
Densley one Negro girl named Sarah to her and her heirs for ever

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Esther Waterfield one bed
and furniture which stand in the little room that I now lay on
to her and her heirs for ever

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In the Name of God Amen. I Director Hall of the State
of North Carolina being sick and weak in my
last of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given to God calling
to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that I
am appointed for all one to die. I make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament, (viz) Principally and first, by
all I recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty
God that gave it and my body I commend to the
Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the
directions of my Executors hereafter to be named and as
touching such worldly property wherewith I hath
pleased God to bless me with in this life. I Give devise
and Dispose of the same in the following manner
& form -

1st Item I desire all my just debts should be paid by my Executors

2nd Item I Give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Director Chaplin
all that part of the said Will & Estate that I bought of
Thomas Gregory, to her and her heirs for ever

3rd Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Director Gregory
all my wearing apparel to her and her heirs for ever -
my Will is that the part left or given to Director
Chaplin should be in the hands of the said Will until

Director Chaplin comes of age or marries without age

4th Item I Give and bequeath my book of Corn, Cattle and all the rest
of my property not given away to my two sons Nathan
Hall and Spence Hall to be equally divided between
them and their heirs for ever

5th Item I do Nominate and appoint Spence Hall my son
whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testa-
ment and do hereby utterly disannul all other Wills
Legacies and bequests by me in any way before written
Satisfying and confirming this to be my last Will and
Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 29th day of January 1796
