Item I give to my two sons John Flory and William Flory the land and plantation whereon I now live and fifty acres of Swamp land more or less to be equally divided between them, and if either of them should die without heir, the land to remain to the other. Item I leave the use of all the remainders of my property within doors and without, to my dearly beloved wife, Lizabeth Flory and likewise the use of the plantation also during her widowhood, and after her death, to be equally divided (which my own children, Aaron Flory, John Flory, Timothy Flory, Charlotte Flory, William Flory, Lazarus Flory and Julia Flory, to them and their heirs forever).

I nominate, constitute and appoint my trusty friend Zachariah Morse Executor to this my last will and Testament proving and discharging all former will by me before made, this 27th day of May in the year 1811.

Item I give unto my beloved wife Sarah Walker all the property that she possessed when I was married to her, and all that property that she got by the death of her father and mother, and that property that I bought at her mother's order she takes and takes in my note as her dividend, also I give her six hogs first choice, and one cow with calf by the name of Blossom. Item I give and unto my daughter Polly Walker all the rest of my property that I brought there, three beds and two steady eight head of cattle, one sow and pigs, one desk, one chest, six chairs, one safe, one gun, one watch, one case and bottles, two wheels, two pots, one dutch oven, one griddle, two pork tins, one soap tub, three books, shoe tools and leather, and other things too tedious to mention which there will be an inventory of the above property and if my daughter Polly Walker should die without heir, her property to be equally

divided between my wife and Sarah Gills. I also constitute and ordain my worthy friend George Howard to be my whole sole executor of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal.

North Carolina and County of Currituck, I Mary Gray, widow of the State of Connecticut, being of sound mind and memory, thanks be to God for the same, and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following: First of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me, and touching such worldly estate as hath pleased God to bless me with in this world I give and dispose of in the following manner, to wit: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abigail Pickett one hundred acres of high land, on piney Island to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Gray, my daughter Betsey Gray and my daughter Peggy Gray the rest of my land on piney Island to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abigail Pickett, Joseph Gray, Betsey Gray and Peggy Gray all my marsh belonging to my piney Island tract, to be equally divided between them, to them and their heirs forever. I give unto my son Joseph Gray one hundred acres of land on the sand banks, to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Peggy Gray one feather bed and one shuck, also one trunk, to her and her heirs forever.

And lastly I hereby nominate and appoint Joseph Gray and Jasper Pickett executors of this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking and disannulling all other will or wills heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this, and no other to be my last will and Testament.
