

Round side a corner between the aged White and the heirs of Daniel Duntun deed things entirely along the round side to a chimney post on the bank head. Thence westerly to an oak a corner between the aged White and the heirs of Moses Capps deed thence southerly and Easterly various courses of the said White line to the first station, containing sixty five acres more or less to him and his heirs forever and if he die without heirs lawfully begotten of his body to his sister Harriet Robinson and her heirs then I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Duntun the remainder part of my land and plantation whereon I now live with south half of my apple orchard and one half of my yeopow nursery to contain sixty five acres more or less to her and her heirs and if she die without heirs lawfully begotten of her body to go to her sister Lizzy Duntun and her heirs forever then I give and bequeath to my Grand son Lemmie Slaton forty acres of Land and marsh and swamp joining Leijnsch Bay and Nathan Robertson land with the building being part of the Land and plantation formerly belonging to Adam Robertson dead to him and his heirs forever then the remainder of the land formerly belonging to Adam Robertson dead joining to her Brabbell that I have not given to Lemmie Slaton I leave to be sold by my executor for six months credit and the money to be divided between Zilpah Berry and Lizzy Duntun and their heirs then I give and bequeath ~~to~~ to my beloved wife Mary

White fifty silver Dollars and one cent -

then I give and bequeath to my two Grand sons James Ballance and Levan Ballance one piece of Land on the head of Falls creek after the death of my wife Mary White to be equally divided between them and their heirs

then I give and bequeath to Edmund Douglass son of Sampson Douglass three acres of Land on the west side of the Road that was Gregorys Land at Falls creek to him and his heirs forever

then All the remainder of my property which is not already given away I leave to be equally divided into

four parts one fourth part I give to the heirs of Daniel Duntun dead and their heirs - one fourth part I give to Levan Ballance and his heirs - one fourth part I leave to my wife Mary White during her natural life and after her death to be divided between the heirs of Daniel Duntun dead Levan Ballance and his and Caleb Slaton and his heirs - Lastly I hereby constitutes ordains and appoint my trusty friendly Thomas Poyner Senr Caleb Chividge and Cuthbert whole and sole executors to this my last will and testament as witness my hand and seal this 18th day of September 1824

The Last Will and Testament of Edward Bunnell deceased Exhibited and proved Feb^y Term 1825

In the name of God amen - I Edward Bunnell being of sound mind but weak in body and knowing that it is appointed for all to die make this my last will and testament manifesting all other - I request that my body be decently buried and my body to mingle with its mother dust & commend my soul to him that save it

then I give unto my son William Bunnell all the notes which I hold against him as his part of my estate also my wearing cloths then I give unto my beloved son Isaac Bunnell one bed and furniture one cow and calf first choice two yew and 2 Lambs the track or piece of Land on which I live bounded on the east by the road and on the west by the creek or all my land on the west side of the road where I live, I also give unto Isaac the Bush Horse with the conditions that Isaac shall let William Bunnell have the use of the horse as long as the horse shall live

then I give unto my beloved son John Bunnell the tract of Land on the east side of the road one cow and calf one bed & furniture two ewes also give him my negro called Mels, one slut and first choice

Item I give unto my grandson Matly Bunnill son of William Bunnill the tract of Land bought of shivers
 Item I It is my desire that the remainder of my property be sold my just debts all to be paid and the remainder after paying them to be equally divided between my two daughters Katy and Betsey and my son Thomas Bunnill
 Item I I nominate and appoint my son Isaac Bunnill and C. A. Fisher as executors to this my last will and testament - signed sealed and delivered in the presence of as witness my hand and seal this December 31st 1824

The Last Will and testament of Andrew Duke
proved and exhibited at February Term 1825 -

In the name of God amen - I Andrew Duke being in sound and perfect mind and memory. Blinded by God for ~~it~~ do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form as followeth that is to say I do commend my soul to God that gave and my Body to be decently buried in my graveyard, surely near the South west end of my dwelling house the first part of the grave one foot below the top of the Ground and then the death of my coffin
 Item I lend all my property within doors and without to my beloved wife Rhoda Duke during her widowhood or life and in case she marries nothing but the following property to wit one bead and furniture the first choice and one other the fourth choise one horse and riding chair the first choice, Two cows and calves the first choice, six head of hogs, four head of sheep four setting chairs, one large Juniper Chest one pair of Braß fire dogs and one tea chest and the reason is that I lend all my property in the manner

I have is to keep my children free from expence and to give them learning in that circumstance

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Andrew Duke all of my lands of Every description with all the improvements thereon to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Andrew Duke three negroes to wit George a man, Dick a man and Rebecca a girl to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Andrew Duke one desk, one large Beaufat, one gun one Square Walnut Table to him and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Andrew Duke and Sally Duke my beads and furniture to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally Duke one negro man by the name of Isaac one negro girl by the name of Rhoda one Walnut Table and a small beaufat to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rhoda Duke one negro man by the name of Andy, one negro man by the name of Adam to him and his heirs forever

Item I will all the remainder of my estate not already given away I leave to be Equally divided between my two children Sally Duke and Andrew Duke and not to be sold, but writ out or hired out for the good of my children to them and their heirs forever

Also I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Rhoda Duke Josiah Etheridge and William Etheridge son of Josiah my sole and sole Executors to this my last will and testament
