Currituck and state of North Carolina being sound and perfect mind and
memory, blessed be god, do this 29th day of October in the year of our
Lord 1812, make and publish this my last will and Testament, in
manner following, that is to say. First I bind to my beloved
wife Rosamond Ethridge all my property real and personal &
chattel to her own right and benefit during her natural life,
and no longer, first paying all my lawful debts.
Secondly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Baume after
the death of my wife, one pound lawful money of this state.
Thirdly, I gave and bequeath to the heirs of my son Joseph Ethridge
Vancey & Jemima Ethridge, one pound lawful money of this state
after the death of my said wife. Fourthly, I gave and bequeath
to my daughter Eliza Dowdy one pound lawful money of this
state after the death of my wife —
Fifthly, I gave and bequeath to my grandson Warren A. Dough
all my lands and houses for him his heirs and assigns forever,
for his only right benefit and behoof, clear of all incumbrance after
the death of my said wife Rosamond Ethridge. Sixthly, I gave
and bequeath to my daughter Mary Dough, besides the above
mentioned legacies, two thirds of the balance of all my property
personal and chattel, after the death of my said wife
Rosamond Ethridge. Seventhly I gave and bequeath to my
daughter Sally Ethridge after the above mentioned legacies, one
third of the balance of my property personal and chattel
after the death of my wife Rosamond Ethridge. And I hereby
make and ordain my wife Rosamond Ethridge, and my friend
Barzani Dough, executors of this my last will and testament.

I Elijah Carson of the county of
Currituck State of North Carolina being sick and very weak in
body, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to almighty God
for it calling in mind the certainty of death uncertainty of life
think proper to make this my last will and Testament. —
And first of all, I give and recommend unto almighty God
both soul and body to the disposal of his own good will and pleasure
in hopes of a joyful resurrection at the last day.
I give in the following manner. I bind unto my dear beloved
wife my land and plantation for five years, to her own dis-
posal, to raise my children on, not to give nor sell timber.
It is also my desire that my claimed land the whole of it should
be equally divided between my two sons John Carson and Moses
Carson, the division line to begin at the river and run across par-
allel with my lane to the road, John Carson to have the north
side, if the said John Carson should die without heir
lawfully begotten of his own body the said piece of land to
return to my son Moses Carson. Moses Carson to have the south
side of my land, and if he should die without heir lawfully
begotten of his body to return to my son John Carson. I also
give and bequeath unto my two sons my woodland, to be equally
divided between said John Carson and Moses Carson, and if
John Carson should die without heir lawfully begotten of his
body to return to Moses Carson, and if Moses Carson should
die without heir lawfully begotten of his body to return to said
John Carson. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son
John Carson one hand mill to him his heirs forever.
Item. I give bequeath unto my son Moses Carson one negro man
named Peter to him and his heirs forever.

I bind unto dear beloved wife one negro woman named Betty for life, and at her deceas I give the said negro woman and her increase and one negro boy named Charles to her and her foresses, my daughter Anney Baron her and hers ~~her~~ ^{young} son. Also I give to my wife two feather beds and three cows and coloys, ten head of hogs, one horse and chair and cart, one spinning wheel six setting chairs, one loom three pots and Dutch oven, one bldie chest, all of the dunghill stock all the cauthen ware, the money that is now due, I give to my wife to finish the buildings with and give her of sheep, two pairs of flat irons, slays and geais.

Item. I give to my daughter Anney Baron a newdout boat, and one feather bed and spinning wheel. It is my desire that all that is not given away to be sold in doors and out doors, and the money to be equally divided among my three children, and it is my desire that they shalld have their parts of money at eighteen years of age, ratifying and confirming this to be my last will and testament. I also appoint my dear beloved wife and friend David Morris whole and sole executors of this my last will and testament, this the second of February eighteen hundred and fifteen.

I, Joseph Parr senior, being sick and weak, but in perfect mind and memory, knowing that it is appointed to die, and after to judgement, decently to be buried in a Christian like manner. First, I give to my son Peter Parr, two red cows and their increase, also one gun, two wos and lambs after my wife deceased, also to my son David Parr one ewe after my wife deceased, also I give to my son Joseph Parr, one ewe after my wife Joseph Parr deceased. Also I give to my daughter Mary White one ewe after my wife deceased, all the rest of my property I give to my wife Joseph Parr during her natural life.

After my wife Joseph Parr deceased, I leave all my property to be sold and equal divided among my four children, Maria Parr, Jeppe Parr and Mary White and Peter Parr; also if one of my children dies for the property to belong to my three children, and if the other dies to belong to the other two children, and ~~the~~ after the others die to belong to the other one child. Also I leave my wife Josephine Parr whole and sole executrix, hereunto I have set my hand and seal this 3rd of Octo 1811
