In the name of God amen, I do this instrument of writing on the 15th fourth of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty two Elizabeth Mathias of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of perfect sound mind and memory blessed be God for the same first of all I recommend my soul to God that gave and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial and this instrument of writing to be my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say

- Item 1st I give and bequeath unto John Cox our young man one white cow and nine pigs Ten barrels of Indian Corn to him and his heirs for ever.
- Item 2^d I give and bequeath unto my daughter Aley Dopey one bay horse all my Corn pork fodder to her and her heirs for ever
- Item 3 I give and bequeath unto my three grand daughters viz Jane Morse Aley Mathias & Frances Paray the sum of five dollars Cash
- Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Aley Dopey all the property not willed away all within doors and without that I have accumulated since the death of my husband to her and her heirs for ever
- I nominate constitute and appoint my ^{son} in Law Mr. Dopey sole Executor to this my last will & testament I disannul all other instruments of writing and all other wills do certify this to be my last will and testament signed sealed and acknowledged in the presents

- First I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Lydia Beasley the sum of Twenty five dollars in Cash
- Item 2nd I lend all the remainder of my property to my wife during her life or widowhood if my wife should intermarry it is my will that all of my property shall be sold and equally divided between my wife and children or after the death of my wife if she should never marry again it is my will that all of my estate be sold and equally divided among my children I nominate and appoint my wife Lydia Beasley my lawfull executrix to this my last will and testament December 31st day 1831

First after paying my debts I lend all of my property to Pagan Fatum my beloved wife her life time all with in doors and with oute doors land hogg horses catel negro woman Mary after her death I give the land to Washington Tomphery and the negro women named to Melaney McClanmel and the movable property to be equal divided between Washington Tomphery and Melaney McClanmel my beloved wife Pagan Fatum shall
