In the name of God amen, I do this instrument of writing on the 15th day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty two I Elizabeth Mathias of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of perfect sound mind and memory blessed be God for the same first of all I recommend my soul to God that gave and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent christian burial and this instrument of writing to be my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto John Cox our young man one white cow and nine pigs Ten barrels of Indian Corn to him and his heirs for ever.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Aley Dopey one bay horse all my Corn pork fodder to her and her heirs for ever

Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto my three grand daughters viz Jane Morse Aley Mathias & Frances Pray the sum of five dollars each

Item 4th I give and bequeath unto my daughter Aley Dopey all the property not willed away all within doors and without that I have accumulated since the death of my husband to her and her heirs for ever

I nominate constitute and appoint my son in Law Mr. Dopey sole Executor to this my last will & testament

I disannul all other instruments of writing and all other wills do certify this to be my last will and testament signed sealed and acknowledged in the presents

The Last Will and testament of William Beasley was Exhibited at Faley Term 1832 and proven by the oath of William Smith Esq & Caleb Beasley subscribing witnesses Therto the Executor Relieved & ordered to be Recorded

In the name of God amen I William Beasley of Hatteras being infirm of body but in perfect mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say

First I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Lydia Beasley the sum of Twenty five dollars in Cash

Item 2nd I lend all the remainder of my property to my wife during her life or widowhood if my wife should intermarry it is my will that all of my property shall be sold and equally divided between my wife and children or after the death of my wife if she should never marry again it is my will that all of my estate be sold and equally divided among my children I nominate and appoint my wife Lydia Beasley my lawful executrix to this my last will and testament December 31st day 1831

In the name of God amen I Joseph Zatum being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be to God this 15th day of January and in the year of our Lord 1832 I make this my last will in testament in amen of form as follows that is to say

First after paying my my debts I lend all of my property to Pazy Zatum my beloved wife her life time all with in doors and with oute doors land hogs horses catl negro woman Mary after her death I give the land to Washington umphers and the negro woman Mary to Melaney McClammel and the Murrells property to be eqal divided between Washington umphers and Melaney McClammel my beloved wife Pazy Zatum shall this my last will and testament
