I Robert Bell of the county of Cravick and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory, beseech ye god to this 13th day of May in the year of our Lord 1815, make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say: First. I give and bequeath to my son Robert Bell all my swamp land lying back of Germantown Perkins, also one negro woman named Del. to him and his heirs forever, also I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Bell six acres of land where I now live, and one acre of land, lying in a piece of land my mother bought of George Howland, also three hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever. All the remainder of my estate to be sold, and the money to be equal divided between my son Robert Bell and Polly Bell. And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Samuel Thompson and Willis Bay executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said Robert Bell have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
