These may certify that the following Will was then and there proved
by the oath of James Burnham one of the subscribing Witnesses
thereto, and on Motion ordered to be registered, whereupon it
follows in these words accordingly To wit

In the Name of God Amen the fifth Day of October 1757
I James Wilson Being sick and weak of Body But of sound Disposing
mind and Memory Thanks be to almighty God for his aid and Calling
is remembrance the uncertain State of this transitory life that all flesh
must yield to death when it shall please God to call therefore I Commit my
Soul into the Hands of almighty God that gave it, and my Body to be
Buried in such Christian manner as my Executor shall think most
proper for me, and as touching and concerning what worldly Estate it
has pleased the almighty God to bestow on me with I Give and Bequeath
as follows Viz.

Then I Give and Bequeath unto every one of my Grandchildren to wit
James Josiah Mackinnon Mary Malachi & Joseph & Francis to each
& every one of them one Cow and Calf or to the value thereof to them and
their heirs for ever

Then I Give and Bequeath all the Remainder of my Estate with in door &
and without to my Daughter Ephraim Davis to her and her heirs
for ever After my just debts and funeral Charges is paid And
Revolving all other wills by me heretofore made I acknowledge
this to be my last will & testament & I do likewise hereby make
Ordain and appoint Thomas Davis my whole & sole Executor to see
this my last will &c performed As witness my hand and Seal
the Day and Year above written
