

The Last Will & Testament of George Gregg was exhibited in open Court at May Term 1832
 On the name of Geo. Gregg George Gregg a citizen of the County of Currituck and a State of North Carolina being in a low state of bodily health but of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby certify it as follows.

I then I give to my wife Charlotte Gregg during the term of her natural life or widowhood the use of my plantation and Tract of Land where I now live on
 I then I give and devise my plantation and tract of Land that I have left to my wife during her natural life or widowhood to be equally divided between my three sons John, William & Charley to them and their heirs forever to be in possession of the said Land at the death or marriage of my wife.
 I then I give and devise to my daughter Lydia one feather Bed & furniture it being known by the name of her to her and her heirs forever
 I then I give on fine Chest one spinning wheel and one hatch and one half Dozen pewter plates and one Cow to her and her heirs forever
 I then I give and devise to my daughter Ann one Cow to her and her heirs forever
 I then I give and devise to my daughter Abigail one Cow & three sheep to her and her heirs forever
 I then I give and devise to my daughter Mary one cow and a Harbin and two sheep to her and her heirs forever
 I then I give and devise to my daughter Ann three head of hogs to her and her heirs forever

I then I give and devise to my daughter Lydia the silver Chain to her and her heirs forever
 I then I give the use of all the remainder of my Estate that I have not already used away in debt and aid does to my wife Charlotte during her natural life or widowhood
 I then I give and devise all that part of portion of my personal Estate that I have left to my wife during her natural life or widowhood and at her death or marriage I leave it to be equally divided between my three daughters namely Ann, Abigail & Mary to them and their heirs forever and lastly I now ratify and affirm my wife Charlotte my heirs and sole executrix to this my Last will and Testament hereby Revoking all other wills or wills be me heretofore made in this matter or verbal in nature hereof I have signed at my home at Raleigh
 October 8th 1819.
