The last will and Testament of Thomas Taylor deceased Exhibited
and proved at February term 1818 —

In the name of God, AMEN. I Thomas Taylor of the county of Currituck
(survivor) being very sick and weak in, or in perfect health of body, or, and of
perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling to mind the mortality of
my body, knowing that it once appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament, that is to say; and first of all I give and recommend
my soul into the hands of Almighty that gave it me, and my body I recommend
to the earth, to be buried at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting, but at
the general Resurrection, I shall receive the same again, by the Almighty power
of God that gave it me, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hap-
pened god to bless me in his life, I give, dispose and dispose of the same in
the following manner and form. First I give and bequeath to my son
James Taylor, all my lands on the west side of the road, beginning at a
corner, binding on Josiah Taylors land, thence to a dogwood binding.

Adam Poyner's land to James Taylor, his heirs executors, administrators and
and assigns forever. I give to my son Timmegan Taylor, all my lands on the
east side of the road, excepting the cypress swamp, to him and his heirs ~~forever~~
executors, administrators and assigns forever; Also that said James Taylor
shall have privilege to get rail timber for the old plantation's use if needed
the houses to be equally divided between my two sons. All the remainder of
my stock, household and kitchen furniture, to be equally divided amongst my
daughters, freely to be theirs after my death. Ratifying this to be my last will
and Testament, revoking and renouncing all other instruments of writing.

Lord this May the seventh one thousand eight hundred and fifteen —

Willis Williams whole and sole Executor to this my last will and Testament
the witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12th day

The last will and Testament of George Howard deceased
Exhibited and proved. May term 1818 —

In the name of God, AMEN: This third
Currituck County. Day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and sixteen. George Howard being weak in body, but of a sound
memory, thanks be to God for it, I constitute and ordain this to be my last will and
Testament, ratifying and disowning all others that has been made by me, either by
and writing, so that this shall be taken for my last will and Testament, in
manner and form as follows. First. I will that all my last dues and demands
may be paid, on such convenient time to be paid. It is my will and desire that all
my property within doors and without doors, should be sold by my Executor for six
monthly credit, and the money arising from the sale, for my wife to have one
third, which paid the law allows her, and the other two thirds of the money to Helen
Simmons, to her and her heirs forever; but if the said Helen Simmons should
die of a marriage ~~and~~ before she inherits it, for the property to
return back to the giver. I also constitute and ordain my friend Roger Ball
to be my whole sole Executor, and it is my desire that he will not shew no
