After the death of my wife Elizabeth Matthias, I give to my son William & Matthias one hundred mill, one gun, and one large looking glass and bed and furniture. Item. I give to my daughter Abi Dacey one bed and furniture, to her and her heirs. Item. I give to my daughter Franky Matthias our bed and furniture. Item. I give to my son William Matthias two negro girls one by the name of Cire, and one by the name of Timine and also one negro man Call, and negro woman Name, to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Franky Matthias three negroes Mary, Sarah and Lucy to her and her heirs forever and also one horse creature if any alive at the death of her mother. I give and bequeath to my son William and daughter Franky all my hogs, sheep and cattle after the death of their mother to be equally divided amongst them. I also give my son William & Matthias one horse cart and harness. My will and desire is that all the remainder of my property that I have not given away be equally divided between my daughter Abi Dacey and son William Matthias and Franky Matthias. I also nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth Matthias and son William & Matthias my lawful executors to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twentieth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifteen.

The last Will and Testament of George Rowland deceased exhibited and proved at August tenth 1815 —

In the name of God Almen: I George Rowland of the county of Currituck and state of North Carolina, being weak and sick in body, but of a sound and disposing mind and memory, and calling to mind the mortality of the body, do make and constitute this my last will and Testament in manner following. To wit. First I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it, and my body to the dust to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors herein after mentioned, and to what worldly goods it hath pleased God to give me with I leave in manner following. Viz. First I leave twelve acres of my land to be sold adjoining the road that leads to Jeremiah Perkins' to continue in equal width from the Bell line to the arch at the corner of John Bills fence, also one horse colt, for six months credit. Item. I give and bequeath to my wife Polly Rowland all my property with in doors and without doors, and the plantation, during her widowhood. Item. I give and bequeath all the remainder of my lands to be equally divided between Edmund Rowland and Elmano Rowland and Andrew Rowland to them and their heirs forever. I make and constitute and appoint my wife Polly Rowland wife and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament, revoking all others wills or wills heretofore made by me. In witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 27th day of March one thousand eight hundred and twelve.

The last will and Testament of Bowen Green deceased exhibited and proved at August tenth 1815 —

State of North Carolina In the name of God AMEN. I Bowen Green Currituck County: I of the county and state aforesaid, being of sound and perfect mind and memory, beseeched by god, do this day make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner following, that is to say. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Olive Green one negro girl by the name of Bets. Item. I give to my son Joel Green one negro man by the name of Headach, also one hundred acres of land on the north Banks. Item. I give to my son William Green the plantation on which I now live to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give to my sister Polly Godby five barrels of corn, one cow and calf, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give to my daughter Olive Green and my son Joel Green all the remainder of my property both real and personal to be equally divided between them two, and in case either of them should die without lawful issue the property to go to the survivor. I make and appoint my worthy friend James Nelson Executor to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I set my hand and seal this first day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and 39th or 40th of American Independence.
