

Firstly I give to John Becham and Walter Sikes five shillings each - I Secondly I give to Mary Becham my Saviour Wife the third part of what remains not mentioned in this Will only I give to Mary Becham before the sealing of this Will all the whole sheep and all the Hogs and third of what remains not mentioned here in this Will and to John Becham and Mary Ann the third of what remains each and if in case that any more children happens that he she or they shall receive equal part with Mary my Saviour Wife - I desire my Saviour Son and Mary Ann my Daughter - Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament And as hereby Revoked and Disannulled all other Wills Legacies Bequests by me in any ways before mentioned in Writings hereof I set my hand and Seal the third of May One Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty Eight

In the name of God Amen. Know all men by these presents that I George Dough of County of Currituck and State of North Carolina Am Sick and Weak of Body but of sound Reason and Memory Thanks be unto God for that and I do desire that one day that all men must die I make and publish this my Will and Testament first I give and recommend my soul to God that has given it to me and as for what worldly good that it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose as follows. ^{Wife} First I give and bequeath to my son John Dough my Riding mare Bridle saddle and all my wearing apparel but my great Coat for his part of my Estate. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter partheny Westcott one Ann Ring and fifty shillings in money for her part of my Estate. Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Dough twenty shillings for his part of my Estate. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Gould one large pot

and Twenty shillings for her part of my Estate. I give and bequeath to my daughter George twenty shillings for her part of my Estate. Item I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Dough one Bed and furniture and one Masket one Chest my great Coat and my Land and plantation which will appear by Deed of gifts. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susanna Dough one Bed and Bed Lead with all the furniture one Chest and all of my late Wife Cotton Dough wearing Clothing and my young mare the mare to be sold at Auction and the money put out at interest and all of the remaining part to be sold Consisting of all Hogs and farming Tools and the money to be equally divided between Benjamin and Susanna sold by the Executor household furniture and so forth. And as Witness that this is my last Will and Testament I have set my hand and feet my Seal this 22nd day of November 1790
