 I have & bequeath unto my Daughters namely Mary Bonney
 Elizabeth Bonney & Lydia Wallace three Chests, Two Hurks
 three new broata dishes with all my Tea ware to be
 equally divided amongst themselves with six Chairs and
 fifteen barrels of Corn to be equally divided amongst them.
 I have & bequeath to my Grand Daughter Mary & Anne
 One Negroe girl named Sara to her & her heirs forever.
 I have & bequeath unto my beloved Son John Simmons all
 my Corn that is within doors or without having the fifteen
 barrels I have already give before, to him & his heirs forever.
 I have & bequeath unto my Children namely John Simmons,
 Mary Bonney, Elizabeth Bonney, & Lydia Wallace all the
 remaining part of my Estate to them four to be equally di-
 vided among my four Children above named, —
 I will therefore my son John Simmons my sole Executor of this my
 last Will & Testament, I do hereby attuly disallow revoke & annul
 & disannull all & every other former Wills by me made ratifying
 & confirming this my other to be my last Will & Testament in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this Twentieth day
 of October in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred
 Eighty four.

 & State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound & perfect
 mind & memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same, do make and
 publish this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following
 that is to say, first I leave all & singular my personal Estate goods
 & chattels of what nature or kind soever to be sold by my Executors at
 their discretion & the monies arising therefrom to be equally divided
 between my Grandchildren hereinafter named that is to say George May
 Son of John May & George Tanguah, William Tanguah, James Tan-
 guah, James Tanguah, & John Tanguah Son of William Tanguah
 & my Daughter Rebecca and Susanah May Daughters of George May.
 I also give & devise unto my son Joseph May his heirs & assigns twenty five
 Acres of Land being part of the Land whereon I now live, the said part of
 that part of the said Land whereon my said Son Joseph now lives the
 South Eastwardly line thereof to be parallel to the line of the diagonal
 Swamp side, to hold the said twenty five Acres of Land to him the said
 Joseph May his heirs & assigns forever. X
 I also give & devise unto my Granddaughter Susanah May her heirs & assigns
 ten Acres of Land whereon Hester May now lives bounded
 by & beginning at a Rock standing on the Nth Est of the Road it being the
 corner of my own Land, the Land of Thomas Hayman & the heirs of Edward
 Nickens dead then running as in our mentions & with the said Road
 as to take the said quantity of ten Acres & to make the same square or
 nearly as may be. I do to her the said Susanah May her heirs & assigns
 forever, but my Will is that the said Susanah May & her continu-
 & assigns shall have the use of the said piece of Land & its appurtenances
 untill my said Granddaughter Susanah May shall be of lawful age.
 I also give & devise unto my Grandson George Tanguah his heirs & assigns all the
 residue & remainder of the Land whereon I now live with all appurtenances
 together with the Land which is now in dispute between the & Edward
 Nickens & widow of Edward Nickens deceased & to hold to him the said George
 May his heirs and assigns forever.
 I also give & devise unto my said Son Joseph May his heirs & assigns one third
 or half of the following tracts or parcels of Swamp Land that is to say
 One half of the Tanguah Swamp which I now own lying on the South
 East side of the bridge on Road leading from Camden to Smiths Creek
 & one half of the Swamp which I now own lying on the North West side of
 the said Road, also one half of one third of one hundred & fifty acres
 of Swamp Land lying on the North West side of the said Road.
