I Francis Rollison of the County of Currituck County and Province of North Carolina, being sick in body, but perfect mind and memory, considering and minding the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, and first of all I Give and recommend my Soul unto the hands of Almighty God, who gave it and my body I commend to the Earth to be buried in a decent and Christian burial at the discretion of my exutors, and as touching such worldly Goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I Give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form, First my last debts to be all paid, and first I Give my bequest, unto my eldest Son Christopher Rollison one Hundred acres of land, with the improvement on it provided my Son the Rollison, does not come in ten years if he should come in that length of time I Give him fifty acres joining Jacob Davidson, line and the rest to my Son Christopher and his heirs forever likewise all the rest of my property that I now possess in this world I leave to my four Children Christopher Rollison Elizabeth Barrow Mary Rollison, and Sarah Rollison to be equally divided amongst them and their heirs forever likewise I appoint and ordain my Son Christopher Rollison of Newbern N.C. sole Exutors, to this my last will and Testament

Disaffirming, Disannulling, all former wills and Testaments, allowing and confirming this and no other, to be my last will and Testament, Signed, Sealed, and Published in presence of us, the undersigned, this 22nd Day of January 1805 In the Presence of us, William Morris and John Morris, Records Examined the 22nd Day of Sept^r 1805. In the Name of God Amen. I the said Francis Rollison County of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being sick in body, but of sound disposing mind and memory, altho' the Almighty God for it falling to mind the mortality of the body and it being ordained for all people to die, I do make and ordain this Instrument of writing, to contain my last will and Testament, disannulling all other wills and Testaments heretofore made by me, either by word or writing, and this only to be taken as my last will and Testament, first, that is to say I commend my Soul to Almighty God, that first I give it into my body to be buried, altho' in a Christian like manner, in a place where I shall please my Exutors, hereafter named. And as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bestow on me, for above my debts I Give and dispose of in manner and form, as follows, First my will and desire is that all my just debts, and funeral Charges should be paid in convenient time after my death, Item my will and desire is that my loving wife Mary, should have the use of my and Service of my three negroes, during her natural life, and after her death Give unto my beloved Son Daniel my negro boy in return to him and his heirs Item I Give unto my beloved daughter Peggy my beloved wife Mary's deacon, my two other negroes, namely Wauca, to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body, Item I Give unto my beloved wife Mary, all the movable Estate that was her own property when we came together but is remaining at her disposal at her death, Item I Give also Give unto my loving wife Mary all the rest of my movable Estate that is remaining to me, till she fully enjoy for her Support during her natural life, and then what is remaining is to be equally divided between my loving Son Daniel and my Daughter Peggy. Item I Give unto my Son Thomas one Shilling, Item I Give unto the heirs of my Son Cornelius one Shilling, Item I Give unto the heirs of my Son Will, one Shilling, I also constitute and appoint my loving wife Mary, and my friend Hezekiah Barrow my whole and sole Executors, to this my last will and Testament, to settle all my business according to this my last will and Testament, And the law, shall require as witness my hand and Seal this 21st Day of January 1804.
