The Last Will and Testament of Richard Parr decd.
Exhibited and proved at February Term 1825

In the name of God Amen

I Richard Parr of the State of S. Carolina and County of Currituck being in good health and sound disposing mind and memory calling into mind the mortality of my soul and knowing is appointed for all men once to die having and being disposed to make this my last will and testament Revoking all others but this hereafter mentioned I leave the use of the Land when I now live to my dear beloved wife Frances Parr during her widowhood and all the rest of my property both within doors and without the use only in the joint manner as the law is left and not to make wast of the same

I give and bequeath to my two sons Richard Parr and James Parr the land whereon I now live to be equally between them and their heirs forever after the death or widowhood of my wife Frances Parr

And I give and bequeath unto my children hereinafter named say James Parr, Polly Parr, Lettie Parr Willoughby Parr William Parr and Jonathan Parr all of my moveable property both within doors and without to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever after the death or widowhood of my wife Frances Parr

I constitute and appoint my son James Parr & Dennis Boyer to this my last Will and testament having of all other wills signed sealed and delivered This 24th day of this to be his will in presence of us

The Last Will and Testament of Rejier Whitehouse

In the name of God Amen I Rejier Whitehouse being sick and weak but in perfect mind and memory knowing that I am appointed once to die and after death to judgement leave with discretion of my Executors to be buried in a Christian like manner I give and desire that Peter Sojier the son of Philip Sojier should have a claim of mine that descended to me from my Brother William Ethington that lived in the United State service that died in the fort
