I give and bequeath to my daughter Fanny all my land and tenements belonging thereunto, and all my moveable property in doors and out, after the death of my wife or, widow to her and her heirs forever, and if my daughter Fanny should decease this life before she arrives to the age of twenty one or marries I give the whole of my Estate to my wife to dispose of as she should please, two boats and one gun to be sold at six months credit for the support of my wife and child, this being my desire, And now to conclude I leave my beloved wife and Thomas Jellitt my sole Executors of this my last will and Testament, disannulling all others and have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ten, May 7th 1810.
