and I appoint Charlotte Gregg my sole and sole Executor

I then I bequeath unto my beloved wife Peggy Woodhouse the of
my land that is Chard with the privilege of five water
I will drinker of my wood land. Also I bequeath unto my wife
Peggy Woodhouse negro woman Nabl and man Isaac
and Rebecca

Also one negro boy Arthur & Cabb all of which prop-
erty I bequeath to her during her widowhood and after my
wife Peggy Woodhouse marriage or death I give the land
in the following manner. I then I give to my son Jonathan
Woodhouse all my land that lyeth to the Eastward of the
Brickhole and a crop fence to him and his heirs forever
I then I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Woodhouse the
remainder of the plantation which I now live on beginning
at the Brickhole crop the fence to the line between me and
Thomas Whitwell and along the said line westerly to the
Branch thence along the Branch in Easterly Course to the
Brickhole crop the fence to him and his heirs forever.
I then I give unto my son Wilson Woodhouse all of that
part of the land that was given to me by my father in
his last will that lieth to the westward of the Branch
bounded as follows south by Ezechiel Hollings deceased
land and north by Samuel Woodhouse land to him
and his heirs forever.
I then I give and bequeath to my son Hardy Woodhouse
all of the land and appertinances that was given to
me by his Grand father Thomas White Deer as well
appear by a deed for said land to him and his
heirs forever. and will and desire is that if either
of my four sons Jonathan Woodhouse Thomas Wood-
house Wilson Woodhouse and Hardy Woodhouse
should die without her lawfully begotten on their
body his land shall be Equally divided between the
surviving or living ~~sons~~ sons and so on to the last
I then my will is that after the Marriage or death of
my wife Peggy Woodhouse I give the Negroes lent her
in the following manner. Negro Arthur I bequeath to
my daughter Peggy Woodhouse and one half of
Rebecca during her life and if she die without
her lawfully begotten on her body. the aforesaid neg-
ros shall be equally divided between her five small
Brothers and Sisters.

I give I bequeath to my daughter Rebecca the other half of
Rebecca and negro Boy Cabb during her life and if she
die without lawful heirs begotten on her body the
aforesaid negro to be divided Equally between her five
small Brothers & Sisters

I then I bequeath to my sons Jonathan Wilson, Hardy
and Thom as Woodhouse negro woman Nabl and
her increase and negro man Isaac to be equally
divided between the aforesaid boys and if either

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If them should die with out law full heirs legittims of their
Body there part to be equally divided between the
other three that on any survivors or declines.

Then I bind to my daughter Dorcas Forbes and some
Hadley Woodhouse Negro man's Jakes and woman
Sarah and her in creases to be equally divided
between them and if either of them should die
without lawfull heirs legittims in their body
there part to belong to the other.

My Will and desire is that myro Jacob & Sarah
shall continue on My Plantation untill one thirtieth
Also I bind unto My daughter Dorcas Forbes one part
that bea and Christ Also I bind unto My son
Hadley Woodhouse one feather Bed provided
that the aforesaid Hadley Woodhouse and Dorcas
Forbes doth never sell for any other negroes ever
belonging to my Estate or cause any suits or costs
if they do the aforesaid Negro to be sold for six months
credit and the amount of account of sale to be
equally divided between the rest of My children
I then I bind to my wife all the Mississippi notes
that I have for the purpose of schooling My small
Children at her discretion

Item. I Give unto my daughter Polly Gregory one negro
girl Rose and if she should die without lawfull heirs
legittims in her body the said Negro to go to my
six smallest Children also one bed and furniture
one Cow and Calf one Chest and table where the
Cow and Calf Chest a table she has had.

Item My Will and desire is that My negro Boy named
Jordan be sold by My Executors for six months credit
and the Money arising from the sale of said negro
I Give the one half unto my daughter Polly Gregory
and the other half of the Money arising from the
sale of the said Negroes I Give unto my six smallest
Children. Item I bind unto my wife Peggy Woodhouse
during her widow hood the use of all the remainder
part of my Estate not mentioned in this will and
after her Marriage or death My will and desire is
that what property shall remain be sold for six
months credit and the Money or notes arising from
said sale to be equally divided between my six smallest
Children.

And I hereby make and ordain my blood
wife Peggy Woodhouse my whole and sole exe cutrix
of this my last Will and testament in witness where of
the said Elizabeth Woodhouse hath herunto set
my hand and seal this 2 day of March 1821
