Being of a sound disposing Mind and Memory Calling to mind the Mortality of my body and that this
My last will and Testament, in Manner and form as followeth -
I Recommend My soul to Almighty God. And as touching
My worldly Estate to whom with it hath pleased God to bless Me with I give and dispose
of in the following Manner and form, Viz,

I Give and bequeath unto My two Brothers Simeon Barnard and John Barnard all my
lands to wittever, to be equally divided between them, and in Case either of My two Brothers
Should die without leaving his children of their body their part to descend to the surviving
Brother and his heirs forever. My will and desire is that after my decease My Executors
Pay all my Just debts and after my debts are paid.

I Give and bequeath all the Remainder part of My Estate, both within and without
Deeds of what kind or Nature soever, unto My two Brothers Mother and Sisters
Mormia Simeon Barnard John Barnard As Indian Health Ann Perry Dorcas
Taylor and Grace Lindray to be Equally divided between them, to them and their
Heirs forever.

Lastly I as hereby Nominate constitute and appoint Simeon Barnard and John
Barnard My whole and sole Executors, of this My last will and Testament,
They live and as annulling all other wills to be void, and of none effect,
Given Under My hand and seal this 25th day of July Anno Domini 1798.
