Blessed be the Almighty God for it. Calling to mind the transitoriness of this life & it
Being Ordained One for all people the day I do make and bequeath this instrument
of writing to contain my last will and testament, disannulling & revoking all other
Wills & Testaments heretofore made by me either by word or writing & this only
to be taking as my last will and testament. Just that is to say I recommend my soul to
Almighty God that gave it. And my body to be decently in a Christian like manner
Buried in a place where I shall please my Executors hereafter named. And as to
What worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with for above my debts
I give and dispose in manner and form & form as followeth. First my will &
Desire is that that all my just debts and funeral charges should be first paid in
Convenient time after my decease my wife and desire is that my loving wife should
have the use of all my lands during her life and widowhood and after her decease
I give the aforesaid lands to my four sons Thomas Lebedus Bateman & Ignatius
To be equally divided amongst them to them and their heirs forever.

Item my desire is that my loving wife Rejiah should have the use of all my
Movable estate during her life and widowhood for the support of my children
And after her death to be equally divided amongst them all I also constitute
my friend Thomas Jones and loving wife Rejiah my whole & sole Executors to
this my last will and testament to settle all my business according to this
my last will and testament and the law shall require as witness my hand
And seal this nineteenth day of December in the Year of our Lord Eighteen
Hundred.

I Willis Walker of Currituck County being in Reasonable

good health and of sound mind and memory thanks be to God for the same. And
Calling to mind it is Ordained for man once to die. do make and bequeath this
Instrument of writing to be my last will and testament Viz. I give my soul into
The hands of Almighty God that gave it. Hoping through the merits of blessed
Saviour to receive full and free pardon for all my sins. And Calling to mind
What it hath been pleased God to bestow upon me in this worldly goods I give
In manner and form following.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Rejiah Walker the land and plantation
in land by my wife Elizabeth after her decease or widowhood to him and
his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Walker all the land
and plantation I bought of John Thomson only the use of said land to
my wife Elizabeth during her life or widowhood unto him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Dugan one bed and bed
stead two Hags some Furniture one Iron Pot and sundry other things which
she hath now in possession to her and her heirs forever.

Item I also have the whole of my other estate within doors and without is my
wife Elizabeth Walker during her life widowhood and if she should Marry then
and in that case I give the same unto my four last Children to wit Mary
Moe Griffin and Anne Walker to be equally divided amongst them. And as
for my daughter Anne that married John Daway and is now dead
I have given her dower her part and raised her Child over since it was born
and is now seven years old or thereabouts clear and free of any Charge Against
his father or any other Person or Persons whatsoever.

I do constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Walker and son
William Walker my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and
Testament this first day of August 1795.
