 Once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
 That is to say principally and first of all I Give and recommend my Soul
 Into the hands of God, at his Good pleasure and for my body I bequeath
 It to the earth, to be buried in a Christian like manner, at the
 Direction of my executor, nothing but at the General Interment
 I shall revive the same again by the Power of God, and as touching
 such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life
 I Give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner to wit
 Improving I Give and bequeath unto me, my dear beloved wife all my land
 and house one cow and one horse, during her widowhood the Schoone
 One Mill and all my household furniture during her widowhood the Schoone
 And remainder of my estate to be sold and my debtly paid, and the
 over plus to be equally divided among my Children I likewise
 And ordain my only and sole executor, of this my last will of Testament
 James Phillips and John Williams, and I do hereby utterly disallow
 revoke and disannul all and every other former Testament will bequeath
 and executor, by me in any wise made before this time to take
 Will and bequeath ratifying and confirming this and no other to be
 My last will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto
 Set my hand and Seal the day and year above written,
 Signed, sealed, published, pronounced, and declared,
 By the said John Jasper White as his last
 Will and Testament in the presence of us

 I am I send the any of all my lands and moveable property to my beloved wife
 Wife Abigail Lefkowitz during her widowhood, except the half of said
 Island I leave to be sold by my executor, at private or public sale
 as he thinks most advisable, for her to see for her and her family use
 My part of said moveable property so as to raise my children without any
 claim relying into Court, and further desire for her to give my children
 Good schooling, my wish is for her to keep my negroes so long as he
 Remains obedient and if Disobedient for her to hire him out for
 to help support her and my children
 I am after the death of my wife Abigail Lefkowitz my will is that
 all my property my will is that all my property both land and moveable
 Property to be sold at public sale and the money arising thereon
 be equally divided amongst all my Children now born and that my
 Wife as pregnant with both male and female but should my
 Wife marry my wish is that my land be sold as she have the
 one third of the moveable property sold at her manage by my executor
 My wish is that my wife give my son William Lefkowitz an opportunity
 of joining with her so as to help him and to raise my other Children as
 she and he can agree should they disagree for her to have the whole
 Sale over the property, as above mentioning
 I constitute and appoint my friend Malachi Jones, my whole and sole
 Executor to my last will and Testament in writing whereof I am
 Hereto Set my hand and sealed my Seal to be affixed the 17th day
 of March 1805
