

The last will and Testament of Christopher Robinson dec^d Exhibited and proved at May term 1819

In the name of God. Amen. I Christopher Robinson of Cape Bretonas, being in the County of Lunenburg, being sick in body, but of perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make this my last will and Testament, and first of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it me, and my body to the dust, to be buried in a decent manner, at the discretion of my executors, and as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased Almighty God to bestow on me, I give and dispose of them in the following manner and fashion. And first of all my just debts to be paid, and then I bequeath unto my daughter Polly a tract of land containing 100 acres, bounded with the water on the north and east, and with the water on the south and west, also a bed and furniture with countesspane, also a new linen chest, and one cow by the name of Milpail, also all her mother's clothes left at her decease, with the chest they are in, and one half of a negro woman by the name of Smith, and one fourth of the child that she is with child of at present. Also to my son Benjamin Robinson a tract of land, beginning at said Polly Robinson's line, running north westerly to a large water oak, with a water oak to the north west of the grave yard, with the house and outbuildings, belonging to said land, with the bed stand and bed and furniture, that said Christpher Robinson also my half of Ruth, and one fourth of white she is with child of at present, and one English mill, and one third of my sailing boat. Also I leave to my daughter Betsey Robinson a bed stand and bed that she has given her, also one half of the child that Ruth is with child to her son George L's Tyson. Also I leave to daughter Betsey's son Freeman Wallis Tyson a tract of land, beginning at said third of her Robinson line, running north westerly to a dead water oak, the potato patch, beginning at Christopher Robinson's. Also I leave to my son Morris Robinson a tract of land, beginning at Freeman W. Tyson's line, running north westerly to a live oak, about 1/2 mile north of this potato patch, also a bed to be honestly occupied, also one half of my negro boy by the name of Ben to said Morris Robinson son William Robinson. Also I leave to said William Robinson one third of my sailing boat. I leave to my son Andrew Robinson a tract of land, beginning at Morris Robinson's line, running north westerly to Daniel Tolson dec^d line. Also one bed and one half of the negro boy by the name of Ben, and one cow by the name of Antile state, and one third of my sailing boat. And I do appoint Christpher Robinson my Executor to this my last will, and I do acknowledge this to be my last will, and Testament.

The last will and Testament of Stephen Gaylard dec^d Exhibited and proved at May term 1819

I Stephen Gaylard in my right mind, and memory now make this my last will and Testament, to wit, I give and bequeath to my lawful wife Anna Gaylard all my houses and lands and my negro girl Fanny, and all my stock, and all my property within doors and without doors, to her will and disposal forever and ever, to dispose of as she pleases forever. The last will and Testament of Jarvis Allen dec^d Exhibited and proved at August term 1819

In the name of God, AMEN. I Jarvis Allen of Lunenburg County, the state and county aforesaid, being in my perfect senses, and of sound mind and memory, thanks be to God; calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and obtain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit. I give and bequeath unto my wife Polly Allen a piece of land joining Mr. Holoway's land on the southward and to run from Mr. Holoway's land southwardly along the water so as to contain one third part of my land to the southward of Mr. Holoway's land, and to run from the water westwardly to the head line, then northwardly to Mr. Holoway's line, then to bind his line to the water, containing about 12 acres of land, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abigail Allen one third part of my tract of land adjoining Mr. Holoway's land, on the southward; beginning on the sound side at the land I have given to my wife, thence binding the water southwardly so far as to run a westerly course to the head line, and then a northwardly course to the land given to my wife will contain one third part of my tract of land to the southward of Mr. Holoway's land, containing about ten acres of land, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Jesse Allen the other third part of my tract of land to the southward of Mr. Holoway's land; beginning on the sound side adjoining the land given to my daughter Abigail Allen, thence to run southwardly to James Spry's land, thence westwardly, binding Spry's land to the head line, thence northwardly to the land given to my daughter Abigail, thence binding her land to the water, containing about ten acres of land, to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give unto my daughter Sally Egleston ten acres of land adjoining Mr. Holoway's land to the northward, beginning on the sound side at Mr. Holoway's land, thence northwardly binding the water so far as by running a westerly course parallel with Mr. Holoway's line to the head of Parker's creek, will contain the ten acres of land, to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen ten acres of land adjoining the ten acres given to my daughter Polly Everton; Beginning at the land given to my daughter Polly on the sound thence binding the water northwardly so far as by running a westerly line parallel with the line of my daughter Polly Everton's land to Parker's creek, shall contain ten acres of land, to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my wife Polly Allen and son Jesse Allen my back land, to them and their heirs forever. — Item. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen the remainder part of my tract of land to the westward of Mr. Holoway's land; Beginning on the sound at the land given to my daughter Polly Allen thence binding the water to Edward Holoway's line thence to Parker's creek, thence up the creek to the land given to my daughter Polly, thence easterly to the sound, to her and her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my wife Polly Allen one mare and yearling colt. — Item. I give unto my son Jesse Allen one horse; also one cow called his. — Item. I give unto my daughter Abigail Allen one cow called her cow, I give unto my wife Polly Allen one hundred heifer. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen one cow called Redbird I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one cow called Peg. I give unto my daughter Polly Everton one cow called Rely which cow she has now in her possession. — Item. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one red heifer. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one red heifer. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one small steer. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one bed and furniture. I give unto my son Jesse Allen one bed and furniture. I give unto my daughter Polly Everton one bed and furniture, one chest, one table, one wooden wheel, one water piggins, two head of sheep, and two sows, five head of geese, all of which articles she has had in her possession. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one bed and furniture. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen one bed and furniture. I give unto my wife Polly Allen four head of sheep. I give unto my son Jesse Allen one sheep. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one sheep. I give unto my daughter Abigail Allen one sheep. I give unto my son Jesse Allen one young sow. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one young sow. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen one young sow. I give unto my wife Polly Allen all the remainder part of my hogs. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one chest. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one chest. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen one wooden wheel. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one linen wheel; also one loom, slaps, gears &c; also one cupboard and furniture, also one iron pot, one tea kettle, one dutch oven. I give unto my daughter Polly Everton five shillings money, considering that I have given her an equal share, a money before making this will which she has had in her possession. My will and desire is that after paying all my just debts, the remainder of my estate that is not given away be equally divided between my wife Polly Allen, my son Jesse Allen, my daughter Betsy Allen, my daughter Polly Allen and my daughter Abigail Allen. Lastly, I appoint Thomas Pomeroy my executor of this my last will and Testament. Given under my hand and seal this 26th day of Jan^y 1819

The last will and Testament of Thomas White sen^r, dec^d.
Exhibited and proved at August Term 1819

In the name of God, AMEN. The seventh day of June in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen. I Thomas White sen^r of the State of North Carolina and county of Currituck, being of sound mind and memory; thanks be to God for the same, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following, to wit. — Imp^{ro}vis^o. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Bridget White two negroes named Juda and Harry to her and her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my wife Bridget White two feather beds and furniture, two tables, two chests, one horse her choice, one cart, one riding chair and harness, one linen wheel, one woollen wheel, six flap bottom chairs, three stool chairs, all my hogs, all my sheep, two cows and calves, eight choice, one steer or deer quarter I should her choice, four stocks of beef her choice, one loom and all the tablin belonging to her, all my kitchen furniture, pots, tubs, pails &c; one bar plough, one wading plough, two wading hays, two axes her choice, one hundred dollars in money, to her and her heirs forever. — Item. I lend unto my wife Bridget White during her natural life or widowhood one safe and furniture; and after the death or marriage of my wife Bridget White, I give the above mentioned safe and furniture unto my daughter Nancy Mercer and her heirs forever. — Item. I lend unto my wife Bridget White the use of the land and plantation, whereon I now live to include woodland, adjoining to said plantation, so as the plantation and woodland include one hundred acres of land, during her widow or natural life. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Mercer, after the marriage or death of my wife Bridget White the land and plantation whereon I now live, to contain one hundred acres of land, and bounded to the old lines has heretofore been, to her and her heirs forever. — Item. I give unto my daughter Nancy Mercer two cows and calves second choice, one bed and furniture, one linen wheel, and one chest, to her and her heirs forever, which bed and furniture, linen wheel and chest, she has had in her possession. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my son William White the land that I bought of my son Thomas White, reference being had to the deed Thomas White Sen^r gave me for said land. The bounds of said land will fully appear, to him and his heirs forever. — Item. I give unto my son William White two cows and yearlings that is called his, also all the household furniture that I have given him that he has in his possession now, to him and his heirs forever. — Item. I give unto my daughter Peggy Woodhouse one negro woman called Vilet and her children or increase; also all the cattle and moveable property she has now in her possession, given her by me, to her and her heirs forever. — Item. I give unto my son Thomas White all the property that I have heretofore given him, and he has or had had in his possession, to him and his heirs forever. — Item. I lend the use of the fifty acres of land that lies on the south side of the land given to my son William White, and adjoining the land sold to Daniel Lindsey Esq. unto my son Lemuel White during his natural life. — Item. I give unto my grand son John Jarvis, son of Thomas Jarvis, after
