

The last will and Testament of Christopher Rollinson dec^d Exhibited
and proved at May term 1819

In the name of God. Amen. I Christopher Rollinson of Cape Hatteras banks in Currituck county, being sick in body, but of perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make this my last will and Testament, and first of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it me, and my body to the dust to be buried in a decent manner, at the discretion of my executors, and as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased Almighty God to give me with, I leave and bequeath of him in the following manner and forms.

I do first of all my just debts to be paid, and then I do leave to my daughter Polly a tract of land containing 1/2 acre of land lying between line running north easterly to a large live oak at the southwest end of my potato patch, also a bed and furniture with a country pane, also a new linen sheet, bought by the name of Philip, also all her mother's clothes left at her decease, with the chest they were in, and one half of a negro woman by the name of Ruth, and one fourth of the child that she is with child of at present. Likewise to my son Christopher Rollinson a tract of land, beginning at said Polly Rollinson's line, running west by a large water back to the northwest of the grave yard, with the house and outbuildings belonging to said land with the bed stand in it and furniture that said Christopher Rollinson, also one half of Ruth and one fourth of child she is with child of at present, and one English mustard, and one third of my sailing boat. Also I leave to my daughter Betsy Rollinson a bed stand and bed that she has given her, also one half of the child that Ruth is with child to her son George. Also to my daughter Polly a tract of land, beginning at said Ruth's line, running north easterly to a dead water oak, the potato patch excepted to Christopher Rollinson. Also I leave to my son Morris Rollinson a tract of land, beginning at Freeman W. Ferguson's line, running north easterly to a live oak about 1/2 the north end of his potato patch, also a bed he has already occupied, also one half of my negro boy by the name of Ben to said Morris Rollinson son William Rollinson: Also I leave to said William Rollins, one third of my sailing boat. Also to my son Ruben Rollinson a tract of land, beginning at the first Rollinson line, running north easterly to Daniel Fisher's line: also one bed and one half of the negro boy by the name of Ben, and one cow by the name of white gate, and one third of my sailing boat. And I do appoint Christopher Rollinson my Executor to this my last will, and I do acknowledge this to be my last will, and Testament.

The last will and Testament of Jarvis Allen dec^d Exhibited and proved at August term 1819

In the name of God, AMEN. I Jarvis Allen of Currituck County in the state and County aforesaid, being in my perfect senses, and of sound mind and memory, do make to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and obtain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit.

Imprimis. I give and bequeath unto my wife Polly Allen a piece of land joining Mr. Holloway's land on the southward, and to run from Mr. Holloway's land southwardly along the water so as to contain one third part of my land to the southward of Mr. Holloway's land, and to run from the water westwardly to the head line, then northwardly to Mr. Holloway's line, then to bind his line to the water, containing about ten acres of land, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abigail Allen one third part of my tract of land adjoining Mr. Holloway's land, on the southward, beginning on the sound side at the land I have given to my wife, thence binding the water southwardly so far as to run a westerly course to the head line, and then a northerly course to the land given to my wife will contain one third part of my tract of land to the southward of Mr. Holloway's land, containing about ten acres of land, to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son John Allen the other third part of my tract of land to the southward of Mr. Holloway's land, beginning on the sound side adjoining the land given to my daughter Abigail Allen, thence to run southwardly to James Spry's land, thence westerly binding Spry's land to the head line, thence northerly to the land given to my daughter Abigail, thence binding her land to the water, containing about ten acres of land, to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give unto my daughter Sally Carlton ten acres of land adjoining Mr. Holloway's land to the northward, beginning on the sound side at Mr. Holloway's land, thence northwardly binding the water so far as by running a westerly course parallel with Mr. Holloway's line to the head of Parker's creek, will contain the ten acres of land, to her and her heirs forever

Item. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen ten acres of land adjoining the ten acres given to my daughter Sally Everton; Beginning at the land given to my daughter Sally on the sound, thence binding the water northwardly so far as by running a westwardly line parallel with the line of my daughter Sally Everton's land to Parker Creek, shall contain ten acres of land, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give unto my wife Polly Allen and son Sife Allen my back lands to them and their heirs forever. Item. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen the remainder part of my tract of land to the northward of Mr. Holoway's land, Beginning on the sound at the land given to my daughter Polly, thence binding the water to Edward Holoway's line hence to Parker creek, thence up the creek to the land given to my daughter Polly, thence eastwardly to the sound, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my wife Polly Allen one mare and yearling colt. Item. I give unto my son Sife Allen one house: also one cow called his. Item. I give unto my daughter Abigail Allen one cow called her cow, I give unto my wife Polly Allen one bridled heifer. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen one cow called Redbird. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one cow called Peg. I give unto my daughter Sally Everton one cow called Pidie which cow she has now in her possession. Item. Give unto my wife Polly Allen one red heifer. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one Bridle heifer. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one small steer. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one bed and furniture. I give unto my son Sife Allen one bed and furniture. I give unto my daughter Sally Everton one bed and furniture, one chest, one table, one woolen wheel, one water puggin, two head of sheep, and two sows, five head of geese, all of which articles she has had in her possession. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one bed and furniture. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen one bed and furniture. I give unto my wife Polly Allen four head of sheep. I give unto my son Sife Allen one sheep. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one sheep. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen one sheep. I give unto my daughter Abigail Allen one sheep. I give unto my son Sife Allen one young sow. I give unto my son. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one young sow. I give unto my daughter Abigail Allen one young sow. I give unto my wife Polly Allen all the remainder part of my hogs. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one chest. I give unto my daughter Betsy Allen one chest. I give unto my daughter Polly Allen one woolen wheel. I give unto my wife Polly Allen one linen wheel; also one loom, sheep, gears &c; also one cupboard and furniture, also one iron pot, one tea kettle, one dutch oven. I give unto my daughter Sally Everton five shillings money, considering that I have given her an equal share, or money before making this will which she has had in her possession. My will and desire is that after paying all my just debts, the remainder of my estate that is not given away be equally divided between my wife Polly Allen, my son Sife Allen, my daughter Betsy Allen, my daughter Polly Allen and my daughter Abigail Allen. Lastly, I appoint Thomas Payner my executor of this my last will and Testament. Given under my hand ~~and~~ this 26th day of January 1819

The last will and Testament of Thomas White Senr dec'd
Exhibited and proved at August Term 1819

In the name of God, AMEN. The seventh day of June in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen. I Thomas White senior of the State of North Carolina and county of Edistoek, being of sound mind and memory, thank be to God for the same, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following, to wit. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Bridget White two negroes named Lydia and Harry to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my wife Bridget White two feather beds and furniture, two tables, two chests, one horse her choice, one cart, one riding chair and harness, one linen wheel, one woolen wheel, six flag bottom chairs, three stool chairs, all my hogs, all my sheep, two cows and calves, first choice, one sheep on deer quarter Island her choice, four stocks of buck her choice, one loom and all the tacklin belonging thereto, all my kitchen furniture, pots, kely, pails &c, one bar plough, one weeding plough, two wedding kerg, two oxen her choice, one hundred dollars in money, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I lend unto my wife Bridget White during her natural life or widowhood one sofa and furniture, and after the death or marriage of my wife Bridget White, I give the above mentioned sofa and furniture to my daughter Nancy Mercer and her heirs forever. Item. I lend unto my wife Bridget White the use of the land and plantation, wherein I now live to include woodland, adjoining to said plantation, so as the plantation and woodland include one hundred acres of land, during her widow or natural life. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy, after the marriage or death of my wife Bridget White the land and plantation wherein I now live, to contain one hundred acres of land, and bounded to the old lines has heretofore been, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give unto my daughter Nancy Mercer two cows and calves second choice, one bed and furniture, one linen wheel, and one chest, to her and her heirs forever, which bed and furniture, linen wheel and chest, she has had in her possession. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son William White the land that I bought of my son Thomas White, reference being had to the deed Thomas White late gave me for said land. The bounds of said land will fully appear to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give unto my son William White two cows and yearlings that is called his, also all the household furniture that I have given him that he has in his possession now, to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give unto my daughter Peggy Woodhouse one negro woman called Tillet and her children or increase; also all the cattle and moveable property she has now in her possession, given her by me to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give unto my son Thomas White all the property that I have heretofore given him and he has or has had in his possession to him and his heirs forever. Item. I lend the use of the fifty acres of land that lies on the south side of the land given to my son William White, and adjoining the land I sold to Daniel Lindsey Esq. unto my son Samuel White during his natural life. Item. I give unto my grand son John Jarvis, son of Thomas Jarvis, after
