

To my Son Joseph Jacob Jones. I give and bequeath negro man Daniel, negro man Charles, boy Bush. I also give to said son the tract of Land called Bunty lying in Gibbes wood all the tract adjoining it called Argills these two tracts contain seven or eight hundred acres, also I give him the tract of Land Town in Moyock that I bought of Wilson its the third of a tract of six or seven hundred acres together with all my other Land not already given away.

I desire that negro girls Maria and Sarah be sold to the best advantage, it is also my will, and desire that all other parts of my estate not given away be sold at vendue, the proceeds with my notes, book debts and ready money I should suppose would raise a fund of twenty hundred dollars or thereabouts, out of this fund I desire

all of my just debts of which there are but few and none of magnitude to be paid, and also I plain marble slabs to be purchased out of said fund at the head of each of my wives and the other at my own.

all the balance or residue of my estates not before given away give to son Joseph Jacob Jones. It is my will that if either of my children should die under aged or without issue, that its share of estate should go equally, between my surviving children or their heirs. I own three quarter sections of allottery Bounty Land in the state of Illinois, which I also give to my son Joseph. It is my will that my son Joseph be well educated and study some of the liberal professions, if he is found to have talents if not some mechanic art, of the professions should prefer the Law. I appoint General James Redell his guardian with leave to sell part of his real estate should it be necessary to complete his studies. I appoint Thos. B. Ferber & Co. Executors to this my last will and testament. Signed sealed and delivered in presence

The Last Will and Testament of James Harris was Exhibited. May term 1823

Know all men by these presents that I James Harris being in a weak state of health do hereby make my last will and testament - first I will that all my just debts shall be paid and next I will that my wife Redy shall have the privilege of the house and east end of my Land her life, but she shall not rent it out against my son John will and next I will and give unto my son John the hole of my Land unless my son Frederick will forsake the presence and company of lady. Richer and if he will forsake her I will that my son Frederick shall have half of my land, I give one bed and bedsted to my son John and I give one bed and bedsted to my wife Redy and I give one bed and bedsted on the same condition of the Land I gave to my son Frederick and I give my gun to my son John and I give to my wife Redy one huffer her life and I leave my Cannow to be sold to settle my debts and I likewise give unto my son John one table, and I will that all that remains in the house shall stand as it is until my wife's death and then to be equally divided between my three children - and this I acknowledge to be my last will and testament duly the twenty fourth day - one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

The Last Will and Testament of John Machie
Deceased Exhibited and Proved at May Term 1823
 In the name of God. Amen. I John Machie being of
 sound ^{and perfect} mind and memory (blessed be God) do this the 12th
 day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and twenty two, make and publish this my
 last will and testament in manner following, that is to say
 First I lend to my Daughter Sarah Bell the use of the tract
 of Land lying on Currituck Shore, that I bought of
 James Phillips: Bounded on the south west by the main
 road, on the North by Thomas Macchie's Line, on the East
 by the River, & on the South East by John Williams Land
 together with Twenty odd acres adjoining said tract that
 I purchased of Thos. Mercer: to her during her natural life:
 and after her death to her child or children forever.
 I also lend to my daughter Sarah Bell the use of Negroes
 Lucy with her three children Melvinas, Charles and Bob
 during her natural life, and after her death to her child or
 children forever. I give and bequeath to my Daughter
 Sarah Bell, all the household and kitchen furniture
 that she is now in possession of —
 Secondly. I give and bequeath to my daughter Judith
 all that part of Macchie's Island contained within the
 following bounds, Beginning at a croppence situated
 about fifteen or twenty yds northwardly of a live
 oak stump, that stands in a Northwardly and West-
 wardly direction from that house that it live in, then
 running eastwardly down said fence to the south
 east corner of the New Ground fence, thence running
 a straight course to the edge of the marsh, where
 my line and the line of Evan Jones here intersect each
 other, thence down the line of the said heirs to a
 white oak, a corner tree, thence a northwardly and
 eastwardly direction to Piney Point in Back Marsh.

thence a straight course to a place called Pins Bridge
 in Back creek, thence the various courses up the creek
 to where it strikes the ditch, thence a southwardly course
 down the ditch to Bullies Bay, thence along the edge
 of the marsh to half Point, thence along the shore a
 westwardly course to little Point and from little Point along
 the bank head to the first flatland with all the improve-
 ments thereto belonging to her and her heirs forever.
 Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
 all the residue of Land that I own on Macchie's Island
 to her and her heirs forever.
 Fourthly I give and bequeath to my daughters Judith
 Elizabeth, Sarah and Margaret all my fishing Land
 Marsh and shoals, commonly known by the name of
 Raymond's marsh and Herring Island, share and share
 alike to them and their heirs forever.
 Fifthly I give and bequeath to my daughters Sarah Judith
 Elizabeth and Margaret all my salt Land that was
 formerly Thomas Bragg's Seed together with all my salt
 pans and kettles —
 Sixthly I give and bequeath to my grand Son Lycargus Bice
 Fifty acres of Land out of the tract I purchased of James
 Phillips to be laid off next to the land that belongs
 to Lemiah Perkins, Francis Morris heirs and Robert Bell;
 and the residue of said tract of Land and Cypress Swamp
 I bequeath equally to my daughters Sarah Judith and
 Elizabeth.
 Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughters Judith
 Elizabeth and Margaret all my household and kitchen
 furniture that is now on Macchie's Island to them and
 their heirs forever.
 Eighthly It is my will and desire that all my negroes
 (except those lent to my daughter Sarah Bell) be sold at
 a credit of six months and the money arising from the
 sale of said negroes I give and bequeath equally to my

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
