

To my son Joseph Jacob Jones I give and bequeath negro man Daniel, negro man Charles, boy Bush. I also give to said son the tract of Land called Denby lying in Gibbons wood all the tract adjoining it called Argills these two tract contain seven or eight hundred acres, also I give him the tract of Land I own in Mozeek that I bought of Wilson its the third of a tract of six or seven hundred acres together with all my other Land not already given away;

I desire that negro girls Maria and Sarah be sold to the best advantage, it is also my will and desire that all other parts of my estate not given away be sold at vendue, the proceeds with my notes, book debts and ready money I should suppose would raise a sum of twenty hundred dollars or thereabouts, out of this sum I desire all of my just debts of which there are but few and none of magnitude to be paid, and also I plain marble Slabs to be purchased out of stand me at the head of each of my wives and the other at my own. — all the balance or residue of my estate not before given away give to son Joseph Jacob Jones. It runs will that if either of my children should die under aged or without issue, that its share of Estate should go equally between my surviving children or their heirs. I own three quarter Sections of McCloskey's Bounty Land in the state of Illinois, which I also give to my son Joseph. It is my will that my son Joseph be well educated and study some of the Liberal professions, if he is found to have talents if not some mechanic art of the professions should prefer the Law. I appoint General James be all his guardian with leave to sell part of his Real estate, should it be necessary to complete his studies — I appoint Thos B. Ferebee & Exesol D. Ferebee executors to this my last will and testament signed sealed and delivered in presence

The Last Will and Testament of James Harris was exhibited May term 1823
Know all men by these presents that James Harris being in a bad state of health see make my last will and testament — First I will that all my testate shall be payed and next I will that my wife Boddy shall have the privity of the house and easement end of my Land her life, but she shall not ent it out against my son John will and me I will and give unto my son John the half of my Land only my son Frederick will forsake the presence and company of Boddy Wicker and if he will forsake her I will that my Son Frederick shall have half of my land, I give one bed and bedsted to my son John and I give one bed and bedsted to my wife Boddy and I give one bed and bedsted on the same condition of the land I gave to my son Frederick and I give my gun to my son John and I give to my wife Boddy one hundred dollars and I leave my Cannon to be sold to settle my debts and I likewise give unto my son John one table, and I will that all that remains in the House shall stand up it is until my wife death and then to be taken down between my three children — and this I acknowledge to be my last will and testament duly the twenty ninth day of one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

The Last Will and Testament of John Mackie
Deceased Exhibited and Proved at Elgin Term 1823
 In the name of God. Amen. I John Mackie being of
 sound mind and memory blessed be God do this the 12th
 day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and twenty two make and publish this my
 last will and testament in manner following that is to say
 First I send to my daughter Sarah Bell the use of the tract
 of Land lying on Currituck Shore, that I bought of
 James Phillips Bound on the south west by the main
 road, on the north by Thomas Meads Line, on the East
 by the River, & on the South East by John Williams Land
 together with Twenty 60 acres adjoining said tract that
 I purchased of Thos. Mercer to her during her natural life;
 and after her death to her child or children forever.
 Also send to my daughter Sarah Bell the use of Negro
 Lucy with her three children Melvin, Charles and Bob
 during her natural life, and after her death to her child or
 children forever. I give and bequeath to my daughter
 Sarah Bell all the household and kitchen furniture
 that she is now in possession of —
 Secondly. I give and bequeath to my daughter Judith
 all that part of Mackie's Island contained within the
 following bounds. Beginning at a cropp'd fence situate
 about fifteen or twenty yards northwardly of a live
 oak Stump, that stands in a northwardly and west-
 wardly direction from the house that I live in, then
 running eastwardly down said fence to the south
 east corner of the New Ground fence, thence running
 a straight course to the edge of the marsh, where
 my line and the line of Evan Jones heirs intersect each
 other. thence down the line of the said heirs to a
 white oak a corner tree, thence a northwardly and
 eastwardly direction to Pine Point in back Marsh.

Whence a straight course to a place called Iron Bridge
 in back creek, whence the various courses up the Creek
 to which it strikes the ditch. Whence a southwardly course
 down the ditch to Billins Baye thence along the edge
 of the marsh to half Point thence along the shore a
 westwardly course to Little Point and from Little point along
 the bank head to the first flatland with all the improve-
 ments thereunto belonging to her and her forever
 Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
 all the residue of Land that I own on Mackie's Island
 to her and her heirs forever.
 Fourthly I give and bequeath to my daughters Judith
 Elizabeth, Sarah and Margaret all my fishing Land
 marsh and shoals commonly known by the name of
 Raymond marsh and Herring Island thence and thence
 albe to them and their heirs forever
 Fifthly I give and bequeath to my daughters Sarah Judith
 Elizabeth and Margaret all my salt Land that was
 formerly Thomas Bragg's Leed together with all my salt
 pans and kettle —
 Sixthly I give and bequeath to my grand Son Young with
 Fifty acres of Land out of the tract I purchased of James
 Phillips to be laid off next to the land that belongs
 to Jeremiah Perkins Francis his son and Robert Bell
 and the widow of said tract of Land and Cypress Swamp
 I bequeath equally to my daughters Sarah Judith and
 Elizabeth
 Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughters Judith
 Elizabeth and Margaret all my household and kitchen
 furniture that is now on Mackie's Island to them and
 their heirs forever
 Eighthly It is my will and desire that all my negroes
 (except those sent to my daughter Sarah Bell) be sold at
 a credit of six months and the money arising from the
 sale of said negroes I give and bequeath equally to my

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
