hibited in open court at New Bern 1833 was proved
by the oaths of S' Hallance & Charles Taylor witness
thereto & ordered to be Recorded

In the name of God amen I James Douglas being very
sick and weak but in perfect mind and memory
thankes bee to God calling to mind the mortaliety of
my body knowing that it is ouer apponted for all
men to die as it has pleased god to blesse me with my
worldly good & dispose of them in the following manner
that is to say I give unto my son James Douglass my
land where I now live also the Privelage of the
Walker Land five years for rail timber five hun-
dred each year also to have the rails that is
now split there also a feather bed and furnature
also one cow and calf also one cow & pig also
two head of sheep also one gun-

Below I give unto my son Anthony Douglass the land that I
bought of Sues Dagers and Thos Williams also one feather
bed and furnature also yoke of steen steer cart
also one cow and calf a cow & pig also two head of sheep
also one gun

Below I give to my daughter Nancy Douglass the
land that I bought of Samuel Walker also one feather
bed & furnature also to my daughter Nancy Cox
five dollars and no more also to my son Clarke
Douglass five dollars and no more also to my daughter
Betsey Easter ten dollars and no more also to Sally Dager
ten dollars and no more also Polly Walker ten dollars
and no more those gettys to be paid in two years after
deces also after paying my just and lawfull debts
the remainder of my property I give to my wife
Mary Douglass & my daughters Nancy Cox and Antong
Douglass and Nancy Douglass to take possession of
these properties at my decease Ratifying this to be
my last will and testament since published this
February the tenth day 1833

testament & do constitute ordaine & appoint my son Charles
Taylor my whole sole Executor in witness wherefore I have hund
at my hand & seal Novr 1829 *Frances Taylor seal*
