their heirs and to each of them one father bed and of either of
them his his lawfully begotten of his body to give to the other to the end
and their heirs forever.

Man named Sam and one filly and to keep his heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath to my son William Kallam one half
of my land and plantation bearing Andrew Dickens land to him
