 do hereby make and publish this my last will & testament in full of my mind
 to wit that I do hereby bequeath unto my son James Enkins the plantation whereon I now live containing out to
 the line which betwixt the said land & the land where my son John now lives containing one
 hundred acres more or less to him & heirs
 I do hereby bequeath unto my daughter Anne Enkins two Cows & Calves, and one good
 feathered pair of live fowls & one piece of land
 I leave to my well beloved wife the care of all my whole estate during for life and she
 and her heirs be equally divided between my sons James & John
 I also appoint my well beloved wife Anne Enkins with my son Joshua Enkins to be my
 whole & sole Executors utterly revoking & disallowing all & every former
 will or wills to me heretofore made or bequeathed & confirming this to be
 my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed
 my seal this 31 Day of August 1768
