The last will & Testament of William Williams, and the last will & Testament of James Parker, deceased
having been shown & thereupon duly proved, and the respective Executors
being qualified in due form of law the said wills were ordered to be registered, according to
the Statute in that behalf made.

In the Name of God Amen. I, William Williams of the said County and
Province being very sick in my perfect Memory, thank be to God for it knowing that I am
approaching for all men to die in the first place I recommend my soul to almighty God that will
will me and body to be buried at the the Burial house among Executors; and that I recommend to be
my last will and Testament, and what I bequeath and dispose of in the following manner -
I leave my Land between my two sons Thomas and James; Thomas to have the share to
Branch and James to have the share but only my life to have her for maintenance, and all
the rest of my estate to my wife and not to be interupted. It is my desire that of my six
pence breads that her children is to have on my land and my Daughter Anne; I bequeath
a silver chain and my loving wife, whole estate Executors, to which I have made of my
Hand & Seal this 23 Day of October 1793

first place I recommend my soul to almighty God that will me and body to be buried at the Burial house among Executors; and that I recommend to be
