It is my will and desire and I do hereby permit that should my executor have any just cause to sell Kelly to do so and either to buy a boy or to put the money arising from the sale of said negro out on interest, whichever he may think the most conducive to the interests of the said Cedar H. Ballentine. Lastly I nominate and appoint Doctor Phineas Sanborn Executor to this my last will and testament. 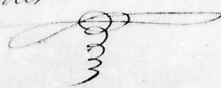

I leave to my son Geo. M. Caffee one negro boy by the name of Isaac and one fether bed and furniture. I leave to my daughter Mary Ann Caffee one negro girl by the name of Hally and one fether bed and furniture and it is my will that if either of the above named negroes dies before the heirs receive them, that they shall have two Hundred Dollars in the place of such debt to make equal with the others. I leave Rachel my negro woman to be sold at five twelve and eighteen months payments also one negro girl by the name of Judy and one by the name of Devenah at the above named payments at the discretion of my executor also all other property that my executor thinks proper either in door or out doors and for she my executor to have all the use of said money after paying my lawful debts agreeable to the above named term and lastly I leave my well beloved wife Mary Caffee my only true and lawful Executor.
