

The Last will and Testament, of Polly Duntow doe was Exhibited in open Court at May Term 1833 and Proven by the oaths of Jonathan Taylor & Frank Duntow subscribing witnesses thereto Enoch Ball one of the Exors therein named Qualified & ordered Recorded & sealed

In the name of God Amen I Polly Duntow of the County of Currituck being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this 4th day of May in the year of our Lord 1833 Make and publish this my Last will & Testament in manner following that is to say

First I give and bequeath to my son Levin Duntow the Tract of Land whereon I now live on Churches Island bounded as follows beginning at the sound side at Martin Jarvis Line thence Northerly, binding said Jarvis Line to the Back line thence Southerly to the Land belonging to Nathan Walker; thence Land thence Eastwardly, binding said Line to the sound side thence Northwardly, binding said sound to the first Station containing 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres be the same more or less also one piece of Land on Pine Island that my Husband Levin Duntow did give me to him & his heirs for ever

I give and bequeath to my son Levin Duntow one negro woman named Wadjet to him and his heirs

I give and bequeath to my son Lewis Duntow one negro Girl named Sadney to him and his heirs

I leave all the remainder of my Estate both as then done and with to be Equally divided between Sobrena Payne Lewis Duntow David Duntow Alexandria Duntow and my Grand son Levin Ballance to them and their heirs for ever

And I hereby make and ordain my worthy Friends Lewis Duntow & Enoch Ball Executors of this my last & Testament, in witness whereof I the said Polly Duntow have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written

The Last will and Testament of Cynthia Boyer was Exhibited in open Court at August Term 1832 was Proven by the oaths of John Brabble a witness thereto the Executor therein named Qualified & ordered to be Recorded & sealed

In the name of God Amen I Cynthia Boyer of the County of Currituck State of North Carolina being very sick and weak but in sound mind and memory do make this my Last will & Testament at the same time utterly revoke all former wills made by me declaring this to be my last will & Testament

First I give and bequeath one half of my whole farm now growing on the plantation to Nelson Coffey my son and one cow & two horses and also I lend Nathan Coffey James & Mariah to lend the Crop with which crop is housed also I give to my daughter Sarah Coffey as much of the other half of the crop as will last her one year and the Balance of crop to Nelson Coffey also I give to Sarah Coffey one cow & two sheep & two hogs

also I give and bequeath to my son Lewis Coffey my Land lying at or near Comstock Bridge to him and his heirs forever. at the same time I do appoint my son Nelson Coffey my Executor of this my Last will & Testament to which I have here set my hand and seal this the 16th day of May 1832

The Last will and Testament of John Becham was Exhibited at August Term 1832 and proven by the oath of Thos B. Davis a subscribing witness thereto the Executor Qualified and ordered to be recorded

In the name of God Amen I John Becham of Currituck County and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this the 16th day of May in the year of our Lord 1832 make and publish this my Last will and Testament in manner following that is to say

First I give to my Brother Thos Becham all my wrights of Land on the Banks and one third of Mr Medcalfs Swine Marsh and 1 Cow and Calf on Swagquarter first Choice

I Give to my Mother Bazel Becham all my wille and portion of land on Sanguar Island and one head calf second choice and one steer on Sanguar Island first choice one head and furniture first choice also one chest on my Sun to Bazel Becham.

I Give my Mother Bazel Becham all my stock of hogs on Sanguar Island and 1 head and furniture second choice I Give Bazel one Cow and calf 3 choice also one table first choice and one head mill.

I Give to my Sister Betsey Becham one heifer I Give to her on Sanguar Island about 3 years old at this time one chest and one lining wheel and one table 2 choice

I Give to my Sister Mary Becham 1 loom 1 profat and furniture and one wooden wheel and all the pot ware belonging to me now in possession of my Mother and set off them

I also Give to Love Hobbs and George Hobbs and Lemmy Hobbs three dollars among the 3 that is to say one dollar each to be paid to them by my Executor when he thinks proper.

I also Give the remainder of my property that is not mentioned before Equally to be divided between Tho. Becham and Bazel Becham and Mary Becham and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend and Brother Tho. Becham Executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed my seal day and date before written

will that she should take her thirds out of the land as though I left no will.
Lastly I leave my wife Sally Harrison Executors to this my last will and Testament this 18th October 1832
